WHAT'S THE BOARD UP TO? October 3, 2023

Call to order: President Frankie Segel called the meeting to order at 10:03 a.m. with the secretary present. The President led the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag of the United States of America.

Second Vice President: Mickey Pajor noted that we had a new Day member, Andy Buckley, who was brought into the Club by Sandra Ackerman.

Treasurer's Report: Corinne Mewhirter distributed P&L and Balance Sheet for September 2023. Checking account balance is \$21,448.81 and Savings Account has a balance of \$73,877.03 for a total of \$95,325.84. She reported that Ways and Means has been very successful having raised \$5,398 from the Christmas in July and Board Summer fundraiser. Treasurer Mewhirter also reported that our licenses are up to date and paid and the taxes have been sent to the accountant.

Financial Secretary: Nancy Zangl distributed a corrected Financial Report for August which now included an \$800 deposit from Evening Mesquite event. Also distributed was the Financial Report for September 2023 which showed a total income of \$4,918.18. Nancy also said that we received a donation of \$500 for Community Service from a member.

Building Chairman: Cherie Williams-DeWitt reported that we received a Grant for a Defibrillator for the Club as well as training to be proved by LVFD. Next reported that the mechanism for the front doors needs to be replaced after several attempts to repair. Next reported that she purchased a Blue Tooth device for only \$59 versus the original quote of 600. A proposal was received from Roberts Flooring (Connie Freeman's husband) to repair and replace the flooring in the Clubhouse for \$18,000 which includes a savings of \$15,000 if we use the carpet tiles they will donate to the Club. Chairman Williams-DeWitt recommended that we start a "Wish List" of projects to be done, including repainting the interior, after the flooring is complete. Recommendation was passed. Consensus was to have the floors done after the close of the 2023-2024 Club year in June.

Community Services: Chris White reported that the GFWC "Day of Service" was a huge success and that over 300 lbs. of food were delivered to the Project 150 facility at Rancho and Gowan. Project 150 also gave our members a tour of the facility which will be posted on Facebook. She further informed the Board that the next Community Service event on October 20 will be "Project 150 Fall Harvest". Refreshments will be soup, salad, bread, and an array of desserts. There will be a Silent Auction, games and she was working on entertainment. It was suggested she get a Tarot Card reader.

Evening Representative: Dolores Martinez was present. She reported that the Welcome Back Potluck was a success at which they shared with members as well new and projective members information regarding the Club, upcoming events and activities as well as having Committee Chairs provide information at Expo tables. Next, she reported that the GFWC National Day of Service was successful and that members collected, delivered, and served at the Community Meal of Catholic Charities. Next, she announced that Halloween Bunco will be held on Tuesday, October 3rd. Next the Holiday Craft Auction was well on it way and that she and Sunny Rae Grigsby will be attending the Friday, October 6, meeting to sell raffle tickets. On Tuesday, October 17th, they will have a Business Meeting with speakers Aaronell Matta and Patrick Sena-Bozarth, who represent the HCA recipient Community Counseling Center.

Ways & Means Committee Report: Linda Zesiger announced that the signup sheet for the December Soup and Bake sale was filling up. A discussion ensued as to whether it should be open to the public since it's on a Saturday this year. It was decided that it should be only open to Club Membership and their invited guests. Distribution of flyers was discouraged. The Ways & Means Committee will work with Corinne Mewhirter and her Committee to decide on how to present refreshments and sale items.

Community Service Director: Cathi Pore thanked everyone who volunteered to help with the Las Vegas History Museum's Dino Ball which went well. She said that it was through this relationship with the Museum that we received a very reasonable quote to print our 2023-2024 Yearbook. Mr. Houghton, a member of the Museum Board, from Horizon Print Solutions agreed to produce our yearbook for \$236.25 versus a quote from our normal printer of over \$800. Books should be available at the meeting on October 6th but noted that there will be changes that were not received in time for printing. She will send change information as she receives it.

Unfinished Business

Chairman Williams-DeWitt had recommended that we increase our rental fees during the September Board Meeting. As there was no quorum at that time it was tabled until October. Chairman set forth the following recommendation "The Building Committee recommends that the price of rental from \$450 to \$500 and the \$600 to \$650. The \$100 deposit is to stay the same." The recommendation was discussed and approved by the Board unanimously.



Please indulge me this personal message.


