Dear Ladies of Evening Mesquite Club,

What a wonderful visit we had to the Blind Center, on October 5. Todd Imholte led 18 of us on a tour of the facility that included a full kitchen,

two great rooms, classrooms, and a huge room where the employees conduct their electronics business of refurbishing, recycling, and reselling of donated electronics, such as computers, cell phones, and printers. This electronics business funds about 60% of the Center's operations. At one point, during the tour, we were entertained by an impromptu performance of the Blind Center Band! Not sure that's their name, but they were very good! And to top off the afternoon, we were treated to a delicious sampling of "Chefs" culinary skills!

As a reminder, the funds we raise at the Holiday Craft Auction, will go toward providing shelter for homeless people who are blind, in the Las Vegas area. They are given a safe shelter for the evening, to protect themselves and their possessions.

Our next event is the Ways and Means, "Low Down, Hoe Down," on Friday, October 29, at noon, at the Mesquite Clubhouse! Come on down for a fun afternoon of a live band, games, and great food!

My experience at the Blind Center, Jessica Fox

I attended the tour of the Blind Center. It was touching and compelling. They have a wonderful building designed to serve in a multitude of capacities. 60-70 percent of their revenue is generated through electronic donations, which are cleaned, refurbished, and resold on eBay and/or internationally. The warehouse looks like the inside of a Costco, with palettes of saran wrapped electronics, each weighing 1,000 lbs. They have a Ceramics Room where they do pottery projects two days a week. They have a band they call the "Broken Spectacles." We got to sit in during their rehearsal!

Their chef is Cordon Bleu trained & trains blind folks to cook centered around the element of cook times. They served us various gourmet courses which included, salad, cous cous, crab cakes, sliders, chicken skewers, & a variety of delicious desserts. They have a fitness center, twolane bowling

alley, game room, and a meeting hall.



Community Service Partnership





The Mesquite Club and The Las Vegas History Museum will partner for the 2021-2022 Club year. The focus of this partnership will be supporting the Museum's educational programs for both students in Clark County and the public.

The Las Vegas Natural History Museum Education Team offers fun, innovative, STEM topics and educational experiences for all ages! STEM Education, a term initiated by the National Science Foundation, is an educational approach which focuses on one or more of the four disciplines of science, technology, engineering, and math.

Items to collect for STEM projects:

- ⇒Copy paper, Construction paper, Cardstock, More or less any paper
- ⇒Crayons, Colored pencils, Golf pencils
- ⇒Vinegar
- ⇒Baking soda
- ⇒Bleach
- ⇒Towels (old are 100% a-okay)
- ⇒Inexpensive flashlights and batteries

The paper is for the dino scanner in the Young Scientist Center, where visitors can color in a dinosaur and scan it onto the TV screen. Crayons, colored pencils, and golf pencils are also for crafts and activities.

Vinegar, baking soda, and bleach are for science experiments. The bleach is also used for cleaning, along with the towels.

Flashlights and batteries are for the Pharaoh's Tomb exhibit, which is a dark maze-like room where visitors can use the flashlights.


Opportunities to volunteer with the Museum


