


Rummage Sale Committee Meeting

Call to order: President Frankie Segel called the meeting on Tuesday, December 5, 2023 to order at 10 a.m..

Minutes: The minutes of the November 3, 2023 Board Meeting were approved as written.

President's Report: Frankie Chase-Segel reported that the Evening Holiday Craft Auction was amazing and is anxious to hear the results from our Evening Representative, Dolores Martinez. President Chase-Segel also congratulated John King for the wonderful job he did breaking down and cleaning the Clubhouse, after the event, and setting up for the US Veterans UMC Children's Fundraiser the next day. It was also reported that we received a thank you from our speaker Iris Hattersley along with a check for a percentage of the books she sold at the meeting. President Chase-Segel reported that Joan Doubrava was not feeling well and therefore will not be able to set up the jewelry boutique at the Soup and Bake Sale as she has done in the past and asked for suggestions to replace the monies we would normally raise from the boutique. It was suggested that we display some of the Lucy Foley art pieces and perhaps members could bring in Christmas items that are in good/new condition to sell along with the items for sales from the Crafts Club.

First Vice President: Sandra Ackerman reported that there are 40 reservations for the Holiday Luncheon on December 15th and requested that an email be sent to the Membership reminding them of the event and to get their reservations in to Nancy Zangl by December 8th. Ms. Ackerman also reminded all Board members to look at the schedule for Board Meeting refreshments posted on the bulletin board.

Financial Secretary: Chairman Nancy Zangl distributed the October 2023 Financial report which shows a total income of \$14,502 which included \$10,345 from Celebration of life and \$2,274 from reservations, raffle ticket sales and donations for the Evening Holiday Craft Auction.

Building Chair: Chairman Cherie Williams-DeWitt reported that repairs had been made to the front doors with no cost to the Club, as opposed to the \$10,000+ estimate given previously by the vendor. The issue with the outside lights was also fixed; it turned out to be a breaker issue.

Community Services: Chairman Chris White reported a friend of Sylvia Phillips had donated 150 hand knitted scarves to Project 150 which Chairman White will deliver this week.

Evening Representative: Dolores Martinez reported that the 38th Annual Holiday Craft Auction Sold Out and was a wonderful event. All monies raised will be going to the Community Counseling Center and Scholarship Program. The final amount of money raised will be announced at the Evening Holiday Party being held next Tuesday, December 12th at Carrabba's Italian Grill. Upcoming events include the Nevada Partnership for Homeless Youth "It's a Wrap" project collecting new hats, scarves, and gloves to be distributed in January and the Ways and Means Super Bowl Bunco being held on Tuesday, February 6, 2024.

Ways & Means Committee Report: Chairman Linda Zesiger remined everyone that the annual Soup & Bake Sale on Saturday, December 9, 2023. The Crafts Group had requested 2 tables be set up for their items. Brenda Dupont said she had a friend who made crystal jewelry and had offered to donate some to the Club; she will contact her to see if she can get some pieces to sell at the Soup and Bake sale. It was decided that the pricing of the soups and desserts will be done by the Committee on the morning of December 9th to be sure pricing is consistent.

The meeting was adjourned at 10:53 a.m.
