



Spring is just around the corner and all those wonderful flowers, gardens, and outside activities will be available for us to shake off the winter. Art from Nature will encompass us.

Friday, April 21, 2023, is our Fine Arts Day Event where we will be able to enjoy the creative accomplishments of our Mesquite Club members as well as from our guest artists. There will be handicrafts to fine arts to enjoy, including knitting, spinning, quilting, collage, photography, wood turning, painting, gourd petroglyph art, art collected from travels displayed, textile art, ikebana Japanese flower arranging, and canapés. Art truly is a part of our everyday lives. Its creation and appreciation make our lives richer while our nourishing our souls.

Here are the biographies of more of our Mesquite Club members and guest artists:

Kathie Clinesmith has exhibited and sold her artwork here in the Las Vegas area for years including at the Red Rock Canyon BLM Visitors' Center. "Having had a career as a high school librarian, when I first retired from the Clark County School District, I wondered what I was going to do with all that newly acquired free time. I figured a house, husband, horse, crafts, and gardening would keep me busy. The first year I grew a bumper crop of Apache dipper gourds which I put in hammocks in the garage to dry. My husband kept running into them and threatened to throw them all out if I didn't do something with them. A trip to the library introduced me to the world of contemporary gourd crafts that I have spent the last 25 years exploring. Gourds are a part of most cultures. They were cricket containers and teapots in Asia, bowls and musical instruments in Africa, bird houses and containers in North America and Sherlock Holmes' pipe in England, to name only a few of their uses. I have always loved the cave painting of Europe and was delighted to discover a wealth of rock art in southern Nevada and the surrounding states which I have used in the designs on my gourds. I like combining these designs with found objects such as; horse hair, seed pods, shells, etc. I always try to always leave part of the natural gourd visible. Gourds have been nicknamed "nature's pottery" and offer an. endless art form to explore and share."

Our Mesquite Club members, **Jan White, and Sandy Holliday**, have gleaned pleasure with their artwork through knitting scarves and hats for charity through their church. Jan told of knitting argyle socks for her husband. Now that is talent and determination. What a wonderful gift to be able to create, give away, and have all the pleasure of helping others. Sandy and Jan will be exhibiting their talents at Fine Arts Day.

Ruth Larson is, "originally from Pennsylvania. I have been a member of the Evening Mesquite Club for 11 years. I developed my passion and skill for quilting when I joined the Sun City Anthem Sewing Club shortly after I moved here. I have been quilting ever since." She will have quilted projects at the Fine Arts Event.

Tobylyn Power is an avid photographer and takes workshops to improve her already competent talent. Her photographs of hummingbirds and nature are well crafted and exceptionally well presented.


We will be inviting chairs of our various committee charities to look for donatable items for specific charities. Those individuals will be contacted prior to the set up.
