

players on February 5! Be sure to mark your calendar and share the event with your friends. We always have a good time.



Call to Order: The January meeting of the Mesquite Club Executive Board was called to order by President Bolling at 10:04 a.m. Barbara lead the Pledge of Allegiance and Collect.

First Vice President: Annette Dorman

expressed appreciation for the wonderful Holiday Party. Thank you to Joan Doubrava for refreshments today. Joan Lapan and Elsa Torgerson are slated for the February 5th next meeting. The January 4th tea was attended by 38 with 3 guests. Honorees were Pat Garcia and Kathy Fehr. This is the last tea of the year with honorees.

Second Vice President: Corrine Mewhirter and Director, Lois Evora are getting together with new members from Day and Evening. Total 111 members plus another lady who paid cash dues and no name is available.

Treasurer: Lynda Schultz handed out her report. The amount of funds donated was corrected to \$2,800 for the Celebration of Life Tile Wall.

Financial Secretary: Nancy Zangl handed out her report. She had a question of what the \$450 donation was, she stated it was a donation she personally made. Report filed.

Ways and Means: Elsa Torgerson noted the committee presented several fund raisers from June1 through December 31. (1) "Yesterday" silent auction, luncheon and a fashion show of vintage clothes. Lunch was a box lunch, similar to Mesquite Club in the 20's and 30" s. A narrative told the history of Mesquite Club. \$2,191.95 was raised to support club house. 12 members donated 162 hours to this project. (2) Funds were raised Bake (\$405) and "Bling" (\$392) and raffle (\$91). 150 hours were donated by 25 members. (3) Terry Lynn's Nuts orders were made in the fall and deliveries were in late November. One member spent 30 hours, total net income was \$310. (4) Celebration of Life Title wall is ongoing, currently \$2,800 is collected for this remembrance. (5) Private Luncheons continue at \$50 per person. We had a very busy fall and about half of our budget for fiscal 2018-2019 has been realized.

Community Service: Sue Churchill noted we held first fundraising event November 30. We brought in \$2,627. After expenses net raised was \$2,227.70 that will be donated to Veteran's Village at the end of club year. Next event April 12 will be "Wine and Paint." Program will start at 11 a.m. so there is time to complete our paintings. Lunch will be served and will be treasures for sale. The Veteran's box will always be available to drop items off. Table on West wall.

Evening Mesquite: Jane Reid reported their group is hosting a Bingo Party on February 5 Event for Ways and Means. Holiday Craft Auction results were: gross proceeds \$15,367, total expenses were \$2,830.51 with net proceeds being \$13,480.16. \$4,000 will be remitted to Nevada Public Education Fund for 4 scholarships. Community Service recipient, Foster Kinship will receive approximately \$8,480 with some minor adjustments for seed money. Their meeting this evening will feature a speaker from the Lou Revo Center for Brain Health.

Building: Cathi Poer thanked the angels who helped set up and take down the Christmas decorations. We have had a couple of rentals along with a big rental for the Accounting group. There have been complaints regarding the ladies' bathroom being cold. A space heater shall be purchased. A problem with the stove top has been encountered several times. If you have this problem, hit the marked breaker box to turn off. Please let Cathi know, as there is consideration to contact the warranty service.

There being no further business the meeting was adjourned at 10:55 a.m.
