


REAL ID INFORMATION!

What you need to know about the REAL ID, you may not need it.

Real ID Licenses



Standard Licenses



Starting October 1, 2020, the government will enforce stricter ID standards when it comes to people boarding airline flights, and entering federal facilities, such as federal court houses and military bases. Keep in mind, some other forms of ID can also meet the requirement. So, you may not need to panic or rush to get a new driver's license or identification card.

The REAL ID is a driver's license or state-issued ID that meets federal identification standards set by Congress in 2005 in the wake of the terrorist attacks of September 11, 2001. If your ID has a star in a yellow circle in the right-hand corner – then you have a real ID.

ner – then you have a real ID.

The DMV wants to make sure people understand the REAL ID is optional in Nevada and if you don't have an upcoming flight on or after October 1, or plan to be at a military base or federal court, you could wait or may not need it. If you have other valid forms of ID such as a passport, U.S. military ID, or other IDs listed on this site, you don't need the REAL ID.

If you do need to get the REAL ID, the Nevada DMV has set up a website to help get you prepared. The site gives information on what you will need to provide to get the REAL ID. The DMV is urging people not to wait until the last minute. <https://dmvnev.com/dlresidency.htm>

You must be a Nevada resident and provide a Nevada street address to obtain any driver's license, instruction permit or ID card. You must also surrender any existing U.S.-issued license or ID card. First-time applicants are required to provide proof of identity (full legal name and date of birth), name changes(s), Social Security number if one has been issued for you and two documents to prove your address.

You must present all of the following:

1. Proof of Identity (one document) AND
2. If you have changed your name, Proof of All Name Change(s) AND
3. Proof of Social Security number AND
4. Proof of your Nevada residential address (two documents)

Documents must be valid originals or certified copies that were issued in the United States (except foreign passports). The DMV does not accept photocopies. Documents presented will be scanned and stored.

I hope that this helps you to understand what you need to do or not do.

Nominating: Lois Evora said that they are still negotiating. She said they still need a Nominating Chair and committee members.

Evening Mesquite: Pat Garcia reported that a check for \$8979.71 was presented to HopeLink. She read a letter from HopeLink thanking the Club and describing the many ways that the money was used to prevent homelessness, hunger and promote self-sufficiency for families and seniors. Their community-service project is a diaper drive and making receiving blankets to give to Help of Southern Nevada's Baby First Services Program.

Building: Cathi Poer described the sewer problems that they have been working on. There is a break in the line between the Clubhouse and the street. They are still getting advice and estimates. Holly Nieto moved that "we authorize the building committee to move forward with the sewer repairs." It was seconded and approved.

NEW BUSINESS:

The motion was seconded and approved. It was announced that a signed receipt is necessary to give to the Hospitality Chair.
