DO YOU NEED HAND SANATIZER?




Las Vegas Distillery is producing hand sanitizer. The hand sanitizer is a liquid and not a gel, so a little different from store brand in consistency and works best in spray form. You have to provide your own spray bottle.

Available packaging is in 8 oz bottles (\$8 per bottle + tax), 16 oz bottles (\$15 per bottles + tax), 1 gallon jugs (\$59.95 per gallon + tax) or 5 gallon drum (\$240 + tax).

They had a tremendous response to the hand sanitizer so if you would like to purchase, please contact them. The information is below. If you cannot get there, let me know what quantity you are looking to get as soon as possible. I will be doing another order soon. The next batch will be available by end of next week maybe. They prioritize first responders and nurses, and based on availability, they will contact everyone else on their list.

As they go through her belongings, Lilly designated that much of her things be donated to the Mesquite Club. This will get us a great start for our next Rummage Sale.


