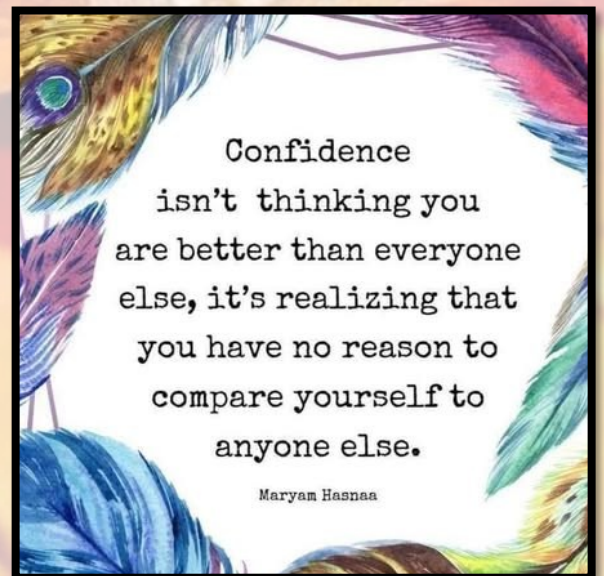

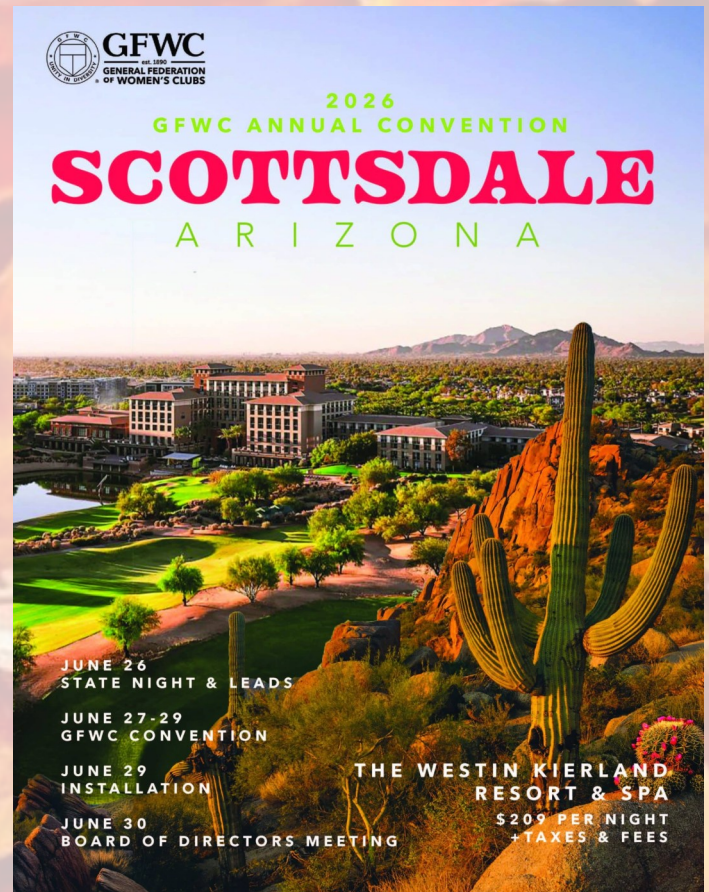

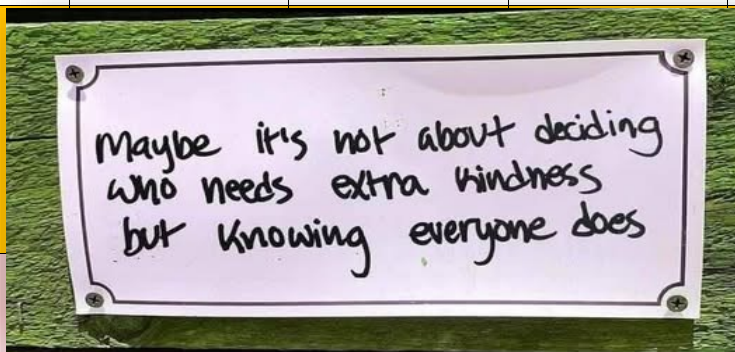

## Notes from your editor.

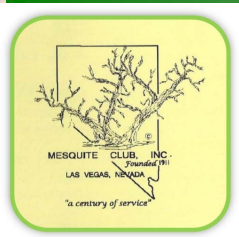
Welcome to fall and a new Club year. It seems like it will be an exciting and fulfilling year.
