

Madeline Wagner – Winthrop Sports Boosters Rambler Scholar Athlete Award

This year's recipient of the Winthrop Sports Boosters Rambler Scholar Athlete Scholarship exemplifies what it truly means to be a Rambler in every sense of the word—through dedication, leadership, excellence, and unwavering school spirit. A three-sport athlete all four years of high school, she has consistently demonstrated elite athleticism, academic brilliance, and a deep commitment to her community.

Academically, Madeline has achieved an extraordinary GPA, has been a member of the National Honor Society, and has played a vital role in student leadership as a member of the Student Council.

On the field hockey turf, she has led her team to four consecutive State Championship appearances, serving as the driving force behind one of the most dominant runs in this school's history. Her individual accolades in the sport are equally impressive: multiple-time MVC First Team selections, repeated honors on the All-State Field Hockey Team, multiple recognitions as the Sun Journal Player of the Year, several appearances on the Portland Press Herald All-State Team, and selection to the MAX Field Hockey Second Team All-New England on multiple occasions. Her success doesn't stop there—on the basketball court, she's earned First Team, Second Team, and Honorable Mention MVC honors, along with a Sun Journal All-Region Honorable Mention. In track and field, she has added to her athletic resume with a First Team MVC and Honorable Mention All-MVC recognition.

Beyond athletics and academics, she has devoted significant time to community service, embodying a spirit of giving and leadership that matches her commitment to sports and academics. Her remarkable ability to balance athletics, service, and academics is further underscored by her status as this year's Winthrop High School Class of 2025's Valedictorian.

She played all 4 years of Varsity Field Hockey and Basketball, 3 years of Varsity Lacrosse, and finished her Senior year playing Varsity Tennis. Caroline's accomplishments with field hockey include 4 Time State Champion, 4 time Regional Champions, 3 Time MVC Champion, All Academic and Captain Junior and Senior Year. During Basketball the team received the Sportsmanship Award 2 years in a row, and she was named MVC All Star Honorable Mention and All Academic.

Caroline has many accomplishments off the field as well, to include earning Salutatorian for her class. She is an officer for the National Honor Society and has helped with service events and community projects. She also was a member of the Student Council and the school news program. 
