Whether on or off the field, this Rambler scholar athlete experienced many successes throughout his career at Winthrop High School. Playing four years of football and leading his team his senior year to the State Championship as the quarterback and captain, Coach St. Hilaire writes that "Andrew is a solid young man with outstanding character who treats all others respectfully including being a positive role model to his freshmen teammates with his work ethic." The accolades don't end there. He was also named a Campbell Conference All-star, State Class D 2nd team quarterback, Maine State Class D all-academic team & the Kennebec Journal All-Star. Even though an injury and surgery sidelined him his sophomore year, Andrew played basketball all other years with his junior and senior years on varsity. His senior year saw him lead his team as captain and he was chosen as a MVC Conference Allstar 2nd team, McDonald's All Star and Kennebec Journal Honorable Mention. "Andrew is a very bright, diligent, determined and one of the hardest working young men that I have ever had as a student or as an athlete," praised Coach MacArthur. Rounding out his

athletic career as a Rambler, Andrew has played on the varsity baseball team since his freshman year and was named the team's Rookie of the Year". He earned his varsity letter in basketball his sophomore year and played on the 2019 State Championship team which brought home the gold ball. The following year as a junior, the team brought home the crystal ball in the 2020 State Championship team. As a senior he led the team as captain and earned the MVC Academic All-Star Winter Athlete award and was chosen as an MVC All-Star and was the MVC First Team player. He was also selected to play in the McDonald's All-Star game. He received his varsity letter in baseball his freshman year. He is currently a team captain leading his team
