



#### Gathered as One Body

Sunday, October 6, 2024

On World Communion Sunday, observed this year on October 6, Christians across the globe gather at the Lord's Table for the sacrament of Holy Communion. The Lord's Table stretches around the entire earth. Catholic Chris-

tians, Coptic Christians, Orthodox Christians, Reformed Christians, Evangelical Christians, Lutheran Christians, Baptist Christians, Anglican Christians, Methodist Christians, Christians who worship in churches bearing names that are unfamiliar to us — all join in worship and do what Christ asked his friends to do: remember him!

"This do in remembrance of me," Jesus said during the Last Supper with his disciples. Then he broke bread as a reminder of his sacrificed body and lifted the cup of wine representing his blood. The sacrament is a vivid symbol of Christ's sacrifice, love and forgiveness for each of us.

As we gather as Christ's family around that table of grace, remember that we are united in Christ with our brothers and sisters around the world. "In Christ now meet both east and west, in him meet south and north. All Christly souls are joined as one throughout the whole wide earth" (John Oxenham).

#### **SPIRITUAL BUT NOT RELIGIOUS?**



We hear people say that a lot, these days. "I'm spiritual but not religious." They just don't need a church, they say. They can feel close to God without organized religion, blah, blah, blah. As though feeling close to God is all that religion is about. I mean, it is about that. Partly. But its about so much more.

I like to think of myself as both spiritual AND religious. What my grandmother used to refer to as "church people." And here's why:

#### Church people have a creed to believe – they confess their faith tradition's creed or God-story

They are familiar with and conversant in both the mythology, that is, the stories of their faith and the propositional theology, the creeds and beliefs of their faith. They know what they believe and why and it makes sense to them and they can talk about it.

### Church people have community to belong to – they belong to a community that enacts the God-story.

They come together regularly with a community of faith into which they have been confirmed and of whom they feel a part. The come to worship and to fellowship as well as to serve and to learn. The community is most effective when it is multigenerational, warm and nurturing, when it sets clear limits and has clear expectations.

### Church people have a call to live out – they feel called by this story to contribute to a larger purpose

They know that their choices have significance, meaning and consequences beyond Themselves. They know that they have a calling to look out for the wellbeing of others. They are morally bound to contribute to God's purpose in the world.

#### They have a hope to hold onto – they have hope for the future that is promised by this story.

God has a plan for the world and we, through our participation in the faith community, are participating in and contributing to the fulfillment of that plan.

Spiritual but not religious? I don't think so. I think we need to be both.

Sound intriguing? I'm gonna preach about it on October 20.







#### What you need:


- Small cardboard box
