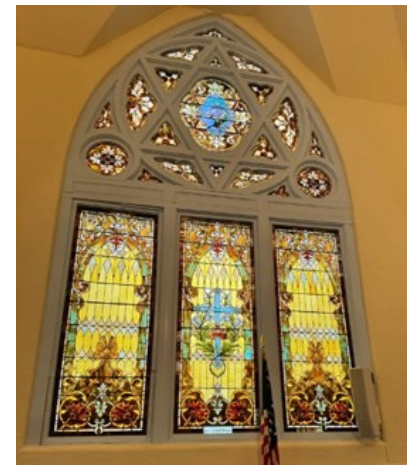

FROM THE TRUSTEES

Our beautiful & historic building is one of the oldest and most valuable structures in Blanchester and we are hard at work to keep it so.

1.) Two companies have evaluated our stained-glass windows and determined that they will have to undergo extensive maintenance work in the next 5 years at a cost of \$75,000 - \$100,000.



Gifts to the Stained-Glass Windows Fund can be given by making your check payable to the church with “Windows” on the notation line.

2.) We have received a \$10,000 grant to help pay for revitalizing our Fellowship Hall into an entertainment venue for our ministry to the community. Total expenses to meet all of our needs, however, will be about \$17,000.

For 146 years, from 1878 to the present, our Methodist church has stood at the corner of Wright and Center Streets, a beacon of hope and love for the entire community.

After a devastating fire destroyed most of Blanchester and our original building in 1895, our current church was built in 1897.

Now, after 127 years of loving care, our beautiful stained-glass windows need some long-overdue maintenance and repair in the next 5 years.

Our trustees have received estimates from two companies who do stained glass restoration and the cost for all of our windows will be about \$75,000 - \$100,000.

Needless to say, we're going to need more than a few bake sales to raise the necessary money over the next five years. So, we are asking the families of our congregation to make a five-year pledge toward the repair and preservation of our windows and our church.

So that we can be faithful to Jesus' commandment to love our neighbors, we are pledging to tithe 10% of all money raised toward missional outreach in our community and the world.

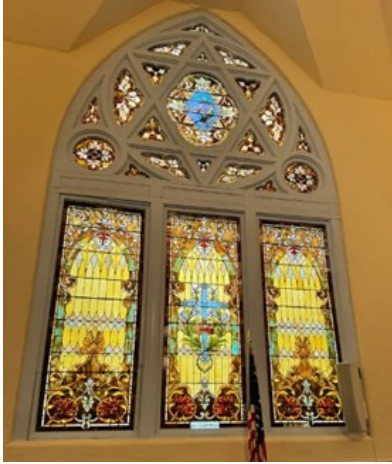

“BELONGING”

The “kids” in the Feldmeyer family are now all in their 20’s, 30’s, and 40’s, and whenever one of the single kids brings a “serious” date to a Feldmeyer gathering the women – my wife, sister, and sisters-in-law – feel the need to explain, or warn, them about the Feldmeyers.

The National Day of Prayer was created in 1952 by a joint resolution of Congress, and signed into law by President Harry S. Truman. In 1988, the law was unanimously amended by both the House and the Senate and signed into law by President Ronald Reagan on Thursday, May 5, 1988, designating the first Thursday of May as a day of national prayer. Every president since 1952

has signed a National Day of Prayer proclamation.

Prayer brings people together. Prayer builds bridges between opposing persons and even political parties. Prayer reminds us that we are created in God's image and He desires for us to represent Him everywhere we go. The theme for May 2 is: "Lift up the Word—Light up the World." This is from 2 Samuel 22: 29-31 which reads, "***For you are my lamp, O Lord, and my God lightens my darkness. For by You I can run against a troop, and by my God I can leap over a wall. This God—his way is perfect: the word of the Lord proves true; He is a shield for all those who take refuge In Him.***"

High School and College Graduate Recognition Sunday is **tentatively** planned for **Sunday, May 26**, during our morning worship at 10:30 a.m.

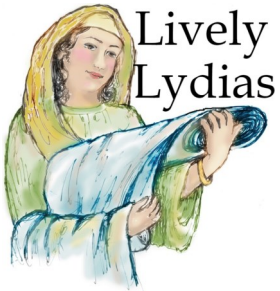
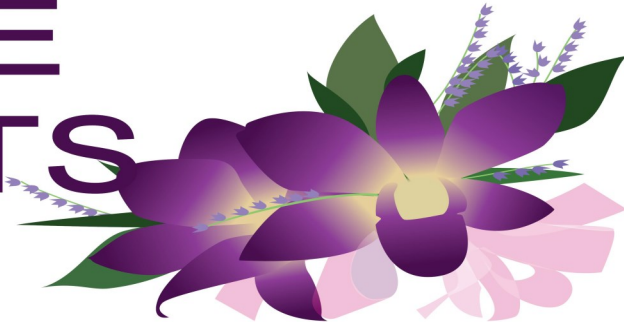

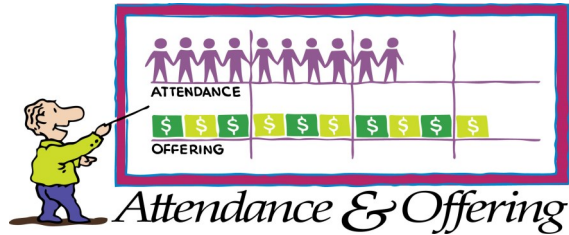
Dear Church Family,

Kids' Korner

a fun Flower Frog

A flower frog sits atop a vase to help arrange flowers and hold stems in place. This personalized frog will become a favorite!

What you need:

- Air-dry clay
- Roller
- Vase (or jar)
- Plastic knife
- Straw
- Acrylic paint and brushes



What you do:

1. Roll out a portion of clay to about ½-inch thickness.
2. Cut out a circle that's slightly larger than the vase opening. (This will allow the finished frog to sit securely on top.)
3. To make holes for stems, use a straw to punch out circle shapes. If you make more than one frog, try arranging the holes in different patterns.
4. Let dry completely. Then personalize your work with acrylic paint.
5. When dry, place the frog atop the vase. Arrange flowers and greenery to make a Mother's Day bouquet.
