Seven Challenges Facing the Church

Church Leader magazine coaches pastors and church leaders toward helping churches grow and be more effective in their ministries. After several years of doing this work, they have compiled a list of what they see as the challenges facing churches in the next decade.

Here are seven of them with a brief suggestion on how to begin addressing them:

Challenge 1: Declining Worship Attendance

Most churches regardless of size or denomination are experiencing decreased weekly attendance, both in frequency and new members.

Solution Idea: Make worship a priority. It is the most important thing we do and this should be reflected in our budget and our calendar.

Challenge 2: Financial Strain

Giving is down in most churches. This parallels Challenge 1. When people stop attending, they eventually stop giving. Solution Idea: Giving is often tied to attendance and when attendance is down, so is giving. Encourage people to give even when they can't be there, physically. And make it easy for them to do so.

Challenge 3: Digital Transformation

Most of us are not very good at digital ministry and the quality that we put out there shows it.

Solution Idea: Know who you are trying to communicate with. People under 40 use Instagram and "X" (formerly Twitter). Facebook is now almost all Baby Boomers. Don't expect people to come to these platforms looking for information. Take the info directly to them with Email.

Seven Challenges Facing the Church—continued

Challenge 4: Volunteer Engagement

People are way less likely to commit today, and they are also less likely to keep the commitment once made.

Solution Idea: Instead of long and deep commitments, create one-hour opportunities and promote them heavily.

Challenge 5: Community Relevance

Churches need to become a relevant presence in their community.

Solution Idea: No need to re-invent the mission wheel. Rather than creating another food pantry or homeless shelter, encourage the church to support the ones that already exist.

Challenge 6: Spiritual Growth

Many Christians simply aren't interested in being challenged or thinking hard about what they believe so they avoid any opportunity to grow in their faith.

Solution Idea: Make growth fun. Videos are available that apply faith issues to old TV sitcoms. Approach scriptural issues through video or music. Break out of the old Sunday School models and create something new.

Challenge 7: Balancing Tradition and Innovation

Too often we find ourselves caught between "recruiting new members" and "keeping old members." We need new ideas and experiences to attract new people and we need old ideas and experiences to keep the old ones.

Solution Idea: Our church's programs and experiences need to show that both old and new have value. New expressions of the old faith are as important as the old expressions. The trick is to create a balanced approach.

I don't think of these so much as problems but as challenges and opportunities and here at GUMC we're already beginning to address many of them. Let's keep up the Lord's good work!

Laughter is Good for the Soul



You don't have to visit the beach to make a sandcastle. Make fluffy "moon sand" to build fun structures.


What you need:


- Large bowl
- Wooden spoon
- 8 cups flour
- 1 cup baby oil



What you do:

- 1. Measure flour into the large bowl. Add baby oil.
- Mix thoroughly until all the oil is combined and the texture is consistent. If needed, use your hands to knead the mixture.
- The sand is ready when it sticks together to form a ball when pressed in your hands.
- Use sand toys and molds to create a sandcastle. Store sand in an airtight container for up to two weeks.
