

WEST OHIO ANNUAL CONFERENCE REPORT Dean Feldmeyer & Rich Peck

1,100 delegates (called "members") attended the West Ohio Annual Conference held May 28–31, 2025, on the campus of Capital University in Columbus. Roughly half were lay delegates representing the churches and organizations of the conference. Clergy members represent the conference. This year's conference centered on the theme "Rise Up, Beloved," inspired by Mark 5:35–43.

WORSHIP

Meeting in the university field house, the worship experiences featured powerful preaching, stirring music, and sacred moments of remembrance, confession, repentance, forgiveness, healing, hope, and a shared vision for the future. A repeated theme in worship was" Loving All, Rejecting None."

Through worship, we affirmed that Diversity, Equality, and Inclusivity (DEI) are considered Christian values that were championed by Jesus and will continue to be values upheld by the United Methodist Church in West Ohio.

STATE OF THE CHURCH

Bishop Hee-Soo Jung gave his first State of the Church Address as leader of the newly formed Ohio Episcopal Area, which now includes both East and West Ohio conferences. He emphasized unity in diversity and called for mutual support and Spirit-led collaboration. A task force was created to explore the possible uniting of West and East Ohio into a single Ohio Conference in 2026 or 2027.

MOMENTS OF CELEBRATION

Ordination of five Elders and four Deacons. Honored 28 retiring clergy.

Commissioning of five provisional Elders and two provisional Deacons. Recognized 19 certified Local Pastors.

Commissioned one deaconess.

LEGISLATION

Amended the conference rules affecting our structure and procedures mostly to be more concise.

Adopted the 2026 budget reflecting a continued commitment not to increase total apportionments for continuing churches. Apportionments will decrease by 3% to \$11.7 million, based on 600 churches.

Adopted the new pension program for active clergy recommended by the Board of Pension and Health Benefits

Adopted 2026 guidelines for minimum salaries which reflect a 3% increase over 2025.

Adopted a rule whereby, effective January 1, 2026, any church building or new parsonage must submit to the District Board of Church Location and Building at least one strategy reflecting a plan of maximum energy efficiency. The district board must approve the plans <u>before</u> building begins.

Adopted a recommendation whereby Bishop Hee Soo Jung and the West Ohio District Superintendents shall create a LGBTQI+ ministries task force to: Support the LGBTQ+ laity, clergy, and candidates for licensed/ordained ministry; amplify their voices; monitor policy-making committees; and support ministries through educational support and collaboration.

Adopted a resolution forming an Ohio Site of the Immigration Law & Justice Network within the conference.

We send our deepest condolences to the family of the Rev. Mac Nicholson, who passed away on June 12.


Mac served at Grace from 1997 until 2004 when he re-



Perspectives on Patriotism

While pondering differences between patriotism and nationalism, Ryan Hamm looks to Jesus' example in Luke 19:41~44. "Jesus, it seems, loved his people, his city, his nation — so much so that he cried over it," he writes in Christianity Today. "He didn't despise his country or wish ill upon it — in~ stead, he wanted nothing but the best for it, and it grieved him to see how his people had rejected his teachings."

This example of "patriotism perfected" can serve as a guide for modern-day Christians, according to Hamm. "It's an example that's both pragmatic and romantic, shot through with justice, truth and love. It's not a nationalistic patriotism — it's a love for nation that doesn't pit it against other nations. Instead, it's a recognition of love followed by a mournful recognition of short-comings."

Put another way, God doesn't love America more than any other nation. And he doesn't want us to worship our nation alongside him, because that is idolatry. Instead, we are to love and proclaim God above any earthly realm.



More Odds and Ends

The 4th of July reminds us of the sacrifices that were made for our freedom.

We think about the sacrifices countless soldiers who have lost their lives, and I don't want to minimize their sacrifices remotely. Without their bravery we wouldn't have many of the blessings we enjoy today.

But we should think about the greatest sacrifice that was made for our freedom. There is a common saying: "Freedom isn't free." To enjoy the freedom we have in our country, people had to pay for it. Likewise, someone had to pay for the freedoms we enjoy from the Law and the punishment our sins deserve:

Philippians 2:6-8 [Jesus] being in the form of God, did not consider it robbery to be equal with God, but made Himself of no reputation, taking the form of a bondservant, and coming in the likeness of men. And being found in appearance as a man, He humbled Himself and became obedient to the point of death, even the death of the cross.

In John 10:18 [Jesus said], "No one takes [My life] from Me, but I lay it down of Myself." Jesus was saying, "I have the freedom to keep my life, but I'm willing to give it up for you."

As Christians we enjoy many wonderful freedoms. Let's be reminded of them each 4th of July, recognizing it's only because of Jesus' willingness to give up His freedom for us.

Make this candle to keep uninvited insects from your outdoor summer meals.


What you need:


- Lime
- 10-20 whole cloves
- Birthday candle
- 4 toothpicks
- Adult help



What you do:

- Have an adult slice the lime in half.
 Cut off the rounded end of one half so it can stand without rolling.
- 2. Insert 10 cloves into the cut sides of each half.
- 3. Stand the bottom half on a plate. Insert the candle in the center.
- 4. Insert the 4 toothpicks in the cut side of the bottom half. Then place the other half atop the toothpicks.
- 5. Before dinner, have an adult light the candle that's between the two lime halves. The flame's heat will warm the lime and create a smell that insects don't like
