


Public Parking Now Available on Camino^Vde Oeste

(between Doria Drive & Lessing) is officially designated-marked-approved by PCDOT: "This section of the roadway is officially a 'PAVED SHOULDER.' It's lawful to park on a paved shoulder in county right-ofway, as long as vehicles are not obstructing any travel lanes or shoulders designated for biking, and adhere to all state and county parking requirements → <u>Chapter 10.40 STOPPING, STANDING AND PARKING RESTRICTIONS</u>"

- ✓ Daily and overnight parking now available for drivers who use their vehicles for daily transportation*
- ✓ Suggested parking area between 1st and 3rd chevron signs (avoid parking in front of Joanna cul-de-sac**)
- ✓ Parking regulated by PIMA County Sheriff, violations will result in tickets and/or towing at owner's expense:
- No trailers, campers, RVs, trucks, or vehicles over 8' ft wide (including mirrors) as they obstruct bicycle lane
- \bigotimes No inoperable vehicles nor expired tags; *PAVED SHOULDER cannot be used as a storage lot for any vehicle
- No parking in bicycle lane—no portion of any parked vehicle may extend past parking line into bicycle lane

PARKING LANE marked with yellow arrows. (park between 1st & 3rd chevron signs—counting from Doria to Lessing)





**<u>Due to prior</u> <u>accidents along</u> <u>Camino de Oeste at</u> <u>Joanna cul-de-sac</u>, we suggest parking between 1st & 3rd chevron signs and avoid parking in front of Joanna cul-de-sac. But you don't have to, this is just our suggestion. (See page 3 of bulletin) "Chevron Signs"
