1-25-26: Sheriff Report #0260120149 illegally parked on Camino de Oeste, expired tags dated Oct 2023 and flat tire. (Posted in April 2026 newsletter)

6-1-26: Reported again by homeowner to Sheriff for the 2nd time—Sheriff placed a green warning sticker but sticker was removed. (Update posted in Summer 2026 newsletter)

- CAMINO DE OESTE PARKING -

Neighbor Action: Report Abandoned Vehicles

Because Camino de Oeste is a public road, the HOA cannot enforce parking there. After Pima County discontinued parking on Lessing Lane, Villas' residents rely on being able to park their extra vehicle there. To ensure these valuable spaces stay available, we work together to prevent Camino de Oeste from becoming an abandoned car lot like Lessing did. Otherwise, Pima may reevaluate Camino de Oeste parking as well. Since law enforcement doesn't regularly patrol there, it's up to all of us to call in abandoned vehicles.

1. **Call the Sheriff's non-emergency line → (520) 351-4900**
2. **Be specific with the location:** *"Along the shoulder on Camino de Oeste between Doria & Lessing"*
3. **Give make, model, and color of vehicle with license plate number, and the year the tags expire**

If a deputy asks why you are calling, tell them **space is limited and cite**  [A.R.S. § 28-4801](#): *"a vehicle or trailer left unattended within the right-of-way is prima facie evidence of abandonment."* **Abandonment rules:** Pima County acts on vehicles unremoved from the same spot for **7 days**. Evidence of abandonment must include not having been moved for a significant amount of time, may be stolen, inoperable, may have **flat tires, expired tags, chalk marking, documented photos or a green warning notice left on the car by a deputy.**
