Dahlia is made of English beeswax, and beeswax is made by bees that feed on nectar from flowers.

So, one could say that **Dahlia** is made of flowers.

You could also say that Dahlia is the Maid of Flowers.

A tiny amount of natural dye has been added for depth of colour.



A fictional story of Dahlia says that she was orphaned at age 4 on an Essex beach by the Romans in their AD43 invasion.

She was raised by the leaders of the Trinovantes tribe, the rulers of the Essex region.

When she came of age, she was gifted a bronze medallion made from the arrowheads that took her parents' life.

When a centurion stole her medallion, Dahlia found her purpose in life, ridding England of the Roman occupiers.

Using natural dyes, Dahlias come in a variety of hues, with the darker ones being preferred as they show more detail in the facial features.

The Dahlia in the lower right of the picture is natural beeswax colour.
