THIS YEARS FRODSHAM DOWNHILL RUN is going ahead at 12.00 midday on Sunday 6th July from the Memorial at the top of Bellemonte Road to Castle Park, where the Festival in the Park will be taking place.

As requested by CWAC, the roads that the runners travel down, plus the roads that 'feed into' the route will be officially closed just prior to the race, and opened again when the runners have cleared the route. Therefore, roads will be closing along the route from 11.30am, roads opening again as soon as possible after the runners have left the road sections of the route and entered the park, so roads will be opening again from approx 12.20pm.

The only reason this may be delayed is if there is any 'incident' occurring that may require for example any injured participant requiring or awaiting medical attention anywhere along the road section of the run. There are paramedics travelling behind the runners - so hopefully any incident can be quickly resolved. She came back and said, "It's done."


He then asked her 3 questions:


The Alternative Collect for Second Sunday after Trinity

deepen our faithfulness to you and to your living Word,


Jesus Christ our Lord.
