## **Letter**

So far, I've seen two houses decorated with Christmas lights and a man wearing a Santa hat and, at the time of writing, it is 22nd November! What a rush some people are in to celebrate Christmas. And here we are just entering Advent. I have to admit that I love all the lights and decorations in the run up to Christmas. When I was small, we put up the decorations and the tree 12 days before Christmas Day and took them down 12 days after and I continued this as an adult. But last year, for the first time, I put up my tree in the first week of December. It did jolly up the dark evenings and I'm tempted to do the same this year!

But in getting bogged down in all the preparations and shopping for Christmas, we can let the meaning of Advent slip away from us. Advent is a time of preparation before celebrating the birth of Jesus, just as Lent is a time of preparation before the celebration of Jesus' resurrection. So, in addition to our preparations of food, cards, gifts and decorations, let's spend some time in personal preparation too - a time to 'Make straight the Lord's path' in our own lives.



Here are a few suggestions for making Advent a special time in itself. Maybe one

(or more) of these may help make this Advent memorable and not just a busy prelude to Christmas Day.


- This Sunday there is an Advent Carol service at 4pm in church. Suitable for anyone. Come along and sing Advent carols to really 'feel' Advent
- From Advent Sunday to Christmas Day there will be a 'Carol a Day' on the website and also on Facebook. This could be a springboard for singing your own praises as you go about your everyday activities (but do consider the neighbours!)
- Take time to do a 'Spiritual MOT'. The answers to the following questions may help you think about what you would like to do this Advent
  - When was the last time I put 15 minutes aside at home to spend quality time speaking and listening to God?
  - Is there anything extra I can do through Advent (as perhaps I do in Lent)? Perhaps a random act of kindness each day.
  - Have I ever just sat down quietly and read the story of the nativity by myself with no other distractions?
- Read a Christian book. In the past, I've suggested reading 'Phoebe' by Paula Gooder. Actually, I may read it myself for a second time this Advent!

Of course, you may have your own ways of making Advent special. I'd love to hear your suggestions.

## News from the Church of England

### **Church carbon footprint tool data update**

One in 14 Church of England churches are now reporting "net zero" carbon emissions, according to the latest data from the Energy Footprint Toolkit (EFT). The number of churches edged upwards from four per cent to seven per cent between 2019 and 2020.

General Synod has committed the Church to achieving net zero carbon emissions by 2030. The scope of this aim was detailed in 2020, and the EFT enables measuring the emissions of all buildings in scope.

Last year's figures, published on Monday 22nd, are based on the 3,600 churches who submitted data. Of these churches, 250 (or 7 per cent) had net zero carbon (or lower) emissions.



Dr John Thompson, Bishop of Selby and chair of the Net Zero Carbon Sub-committee group, said:

“It is promising to see this increase in net zero carbon churches. The rise in numbers of net zero churches reflects that more and more parishes are utilising pre-approved renewable suppliers and addressing the big and small measures which can be taken to reduce carbon impacts. This is a positive early step in our ambitious journey to a wholly net zero carbon Church by 2030. However, we would like to encourage more churches to use the tool so we can build up a fuller picture of the challenges facing the church as we continue our journey to net zero.”


Among the churches with net zero carbon, just under 80 per cent were using wholly renewable electricity tariffs. The success in churches was also reflected by encouraging results from “other buildings” which include church halls. From the 500 buildings surveyed 20 (or four per cent) were considered as net zero carbon, or less. Like other data from 2020, the EFT’s findings were impacted by the global pandemic.
