FROM TONY M, We were in Kiel, Germany, last Month which was our first port of call on a Scandinavian and Baltic cruise. Whilst there we visited the church of Sankt Nikolai which is considered to be the oldest building in the city. Its origins go back to the first half of the 13th century. In front of the church there is a bronze sculpture, The Spirit Warrior, created by the sculptor Ernst Barlach. It is of an angel standing on top of a wolf like animal. The sculpture represents the victory of the spirit over evil. There was a party of school children who were quietly moving around making notes and gathering information. I spoke to one of their teachers who told me that the children were her Religious Education class. They were learning about Martin Luther and the Reformation. Although the church was busy and quite noisy there was an atmosphere of calm and serenity which said that it is indeed a place of prayer.


