Lesson Text: Psalm 114:18-29 Related Scriptures: Isaiah 8:13-17

Matthew 21:42-46 Ephesians 2:14-22

1 Peter 2:4-8

Time of Action: Unknown

Place of Action: Probably Jerusalem

Introduction to the Lesson Text

Golden Text: "The stone which the builders refused is become the head stone of the corner" (Psalms 118:22).

In Bible times, the cornerstone of a building was the most important stone because if it was not exactly right, the whole building would be out of line. All stones would be inspected, and all but the perfect one would be rejected. Jesus applied Psalm 118:22 to Himself, indicating that He had been rejected by the Jewish leaders despite His perfection. Our lesson this week further exalts Jesus as the most important stone of God's spiritual building, the church.

- 10. What appropriate responses to the Lord's works does the author describe?
