Introduction to the Lesson Text

Why is it that some Christians are "IMPATIENT" when having to "WAIT" for the things that could seemingly be beneficial now? In fact, we seldom get what we really want immediately any way. [Psalms 27:14](#) says "WAIT" on the Lord, and [1 Corinthians 13:4](#) says love is "PATIENT". Therefore, this may be the answer to the question. God may desire to teach us some things as we "PATIENTLY WAIT" for Him to answer our prayers. If the Lord had immediately freed the Israelites from slavery, their knowledge and understanding of the power of God would have been greatly limited. When Israel's deliverance finally came, no one could have confused the only true God with the powerless false gods of Pharaoh and the Egyptians. Without the plagues on Egypt, neither the Egyptians nor the Israelites would have been fully persuaded in the power of the Almighty God, and His power over all the other gods of Egypt.

QUESTIONS

1. Who and what died during the final plague of Exodus? Why?
2. How did the plague demonstrate the powerlessness of the gods of Pharaoh and the Egyptians?
3. What was Pharaoh and the Egyptians response to the final plague? Why?
4. Why did Pharaoh ask Moses and Aaron to bless him when Pharaoh presumed to be a god himself? What kind of blessing was Pharaoh asking for?
5. What did the Egyptians supply the Israelites with? How did this come about? Ex 11:2-3
6. What image does Exodus use to describe the Israelites receiving goods from the Egyptians?
7. How many men (excluding women and children) departed from Egypt during Exodus? Were they all Israelite men? If not, why?

8. How many years were the Israelites living in Egypt "BEFORE" being oppressed as slaves? How many years were the Israelites "OPPRESSED" before their deliverance came? (Gen 15:13) This question is for "DISCUSSION".
9. Why didn't Pharaoh, presuming to be a firstborn son of his father, die during the tenth plague?
10. How was Israel's deliverance remembered? Why was it so important to be remembered?
11. How should our deliverance be remembered today in Christ Jesus? Why is it so important that we remember what the Lord Jesus has done? This question is for "DISCUSSION".
