THE POWER OF PRAYER

Power = Authority granted to believers to commune with God through Jesus Christ our Lord

Prayer = the act of talking to God making our request known to him with humbleness of heart. Can be done in any posture: Bowing, Kneeling, Lying on your face, Standing, Sitting, etc. (I believe that it is safe to say that Prayer causes the Godhead to act-or do something)

Prayer must be mixed with Faith; is dependent upon Faith (Matthew 21:22) And all things, whatsoever ye shall ask in prayer, believing, ye shall receive. (St. John 14:13-14) And whatsoever ye shall ask in my name (this is referring to Jesus's name) that will I do that the Father may be glorified in the Son. If ye shall ask any thing in my name (again, this is referring to Jesus's name) I will do it. (Mark 11:24) Therefore I say unto you, what things soever ye desire when ye pray (ask God for something or make a request known to him) believe that ye receive them and ye shall have them. (We ask a lot of things of God and I'm so glad for Romans 8:26, 27, which lets us know that the Holy Spirit aides us when we pray. It reads: Likewise the Spirit helpeth our infirmities for we know not what we should pray for as we ought: but the Spirit itself maketh intercession for us with groanings that cannot be uttered. 27-And he that searcheth the hearts knoweth what is the mind of the Spirit, because he maketh intercession for the saints according to the will of God.)

The Power that the believer has is "Increased by Self-Denial (Matthew 17:21) Howbeit, this kind goeth not out but by prayer and fasting. Fasting is a form of self-denial. An example of this is found in (Matthew 17:14 & 16) in the testimony of the man whose son was a lunatic (vs. 14); And I brought him to thy disciples and they could not cure him (vs. 16). (Matthew 17:17) Then Jesus answered and said, O Faithless and perverse generation, how long shall I be with you? How long shall I suffer you? Bring him hither to me (vs.18). And Jesus rebuked the devil and he departed out of him; and the child was cured that very hour.

Prayer is "Unlimited to those who abide in Christ (John 15:7) If ye abide in me, and my words abide in you, ye shall ask what ye will and it shall be done unto you. (1 Thessalonians 5:17) Pray without ceasing. (in other words, talk to me continuously, on a regular basis, any time, anywhere, there's no limit, no certain amount of times, etc.)

"To be most Effective, prayer should be accompanied by Praise". (Acts 16:25) And at midnight Paul and Silas prayed (they communed with God – may have been <u>asking</u> for deliverance from prison) and sang <u>praises</u> unto God, and the prisoners heard them.

Prayer causes God's Devine Hearing: (1 Peter 3:12) For the eyes of the Lord are over the righteous, and his ears are open unto their <u>prayers</u>: but the face of the Lord is against them that do evil. (Psalm 34:15) The eyes of the Lord are upon the righteous, and his ears are open unto their cry.
