

Over the years the business experienced highs and lows, but over the course of 37 years it always grew in sales a little each year. Challenges always lurked in the shadows, mostly in the form of cash flow, and more recently, overbearing governmental regulations, taxes and fees, and mandatory insurance requirements. Sorry to say, but the climate for small businesses in California is not a friendly one.


Looking on the bright side, we have so much to be grateful for. We've had employees stay with us for 35 years, 30 years, and several others in excess of 12 years. Our greatest rewards come from the relationships and friendships that we have developed with our customers.
