

Warren was Modoc County's Director for Environmental Health for 21 years. It was a great position for him, but now as Public Works Director he will move from a regulatory job to a project-oriented position.

- a new sewer project/facility by 2026 will change to holding ponds with an aeration and denitrification process treated to drinking standards. Will move the facility out-of-town and no longer discharge into the Pit River.
- Using COVID funds to re-fiberglass the swimming pool. Hope to open in 2024. And hoping City is successful in receiving grants for a new pool.
- Geothermal heat exchange
- In partnership with the County Redo Park the project has been slimmed down a bit to accommodate rising costs. Also road work for 8th, 4th, E, C, and Nagel Streets.
- Drinking water quality
- Airport Fences
- Will work with Pool and Recreation Committee for upcoming projects
- GIS Arc-Info layering underway



Falconer Bo Bastian - WOW!

Alan Cain arranged for Falconer Bo Bastian to share his amazing skills on January 9th. Bo and Lauren Bastian live in Cedarville enjoying the open desert skies to practice their falconry. Bo's dad Brad Bastian introduced them to our wonderful Modoc country.

Bo introduced us to Stout, a female peregrine falcon. Peregrines are the fastest bird of prey. They can reach 249 mph! They are the perfect apex predator. They are friendly and easier to train than other birds.

Bo is a Master Class Falconer which is the practice of pursuing wild game with wild birds. "Manning" is getting the birds to be used to a human handler. Eventually they will hunt game. Many birds are bred in captivity, and with a license (which Bo has), wild young birds can be captured. Falcons, hawks, and eagles are used to pursue waterfowl, pheasant, and quail.

The head mask hood covers the bird's eyes and keeps them calm. It is made from thin-grade cowhide or kangaroo hide. During training the bird is tethered on a long line a fed by hand. Bo feed them pigeons, quail and other similar foods. Red-tailed hawks pursue varmints.

















Modoc County Board of Supervisors Recognizes Modoc Middle School Interact Club



Our Rotary Commitments - A gentle reminder!

When we all joined Rotary, we were introduced to the best and most enriching organization in the world. (Maybe a personal opinion, but to me it is!) As with all memberships, it comes with commitment! Commitment to attend weekly meetings, to fundraising events which are held throughout the year, and to meeting the financial obligations of the club. For a refresher here are the 2023-24 obligations:

- •<u>Annual Dues</u>: Rotarians pay \$145 yearly, either in full on July 1 or \$72.50 on July 1 and \$72.50 on January 1. The dues go to Rotary International, Rotary District 5190, and the Club, and are required of all Rotarians.
- •Weekly Lunches: Lunch costs \$20 per week (for 49 weeks), of which \$15 pays for the meal, and the remaining \$5 stays with the club. Members must pay even during absences as we are committed to paying the restaurant for the meals. When more than one family or corporate member attends a meeting, they will pay for their lunch.
- •<u>Happy Pot</u>: The weekly happy pot allows individual, family, or corporate members to donate to the club on an upbeat note and at their own pace. It is recommended that members contribute \$100 annually to the Happy Pot.
- •Rotary Trivia: Individual, family, or corporate members are asked questions and pay \$10 for incorrect answers. This is an enlightening and fun means to build a recommended \$50 per year for each member. These funds are used to pay for \$50 of the \$100/member needed to be a Sustaining Member Rotary Club. The Club contributes the remaining \$50 to the District.
- •Rotary's Polio Plus and Annual Fund programs: Our club goal is \$3,000 for 2023 2024. This money is obtained through fundraisers and donations throughout the year. Individual, family, and corporate members also support additional Rotary International projects according to personal desires. Funds are contributed to the Club Treasurer or through Rotary Direct.

As we are looking at the end of the current Rotary year (June 30), please ensure that your annual commitments / financial obligations are up to date and will be met by June 30th. (Thank you to all of you who have done so already!) If you have any questions as to where you stand, we can provide confidential information).
