

Villa Savoye (1931)


Corbusier's fenêtre en longueur liberated the facade from the structure. Reliance honors this "Free Plan" with ultra-slim profiles that maximize glass area, ensuring the panoramic view remains uninterrupted and the insulation uncompromised.

# Dissolving the Corner

Fallingwater (1935)



Wright despised “visual barriers,” using windows as “light screens” to frame nature. We replicate this organic seamlessness with structural glazing techniques that erase the corner post, merging the interior sanctuary with the world outside.




# The Glass Skin

The Bauhaus (1926)

Here, the wall became a “non-load-bearing skin.” This paved the way for the modern skyline. Reliance curtain wall systems master this delicate separation, providing lightweight, rapid-assembly facades that define the aesthetic of modern commerce.

Burj Khalifa (2010)
