
Mohawk River Basin Steering Committee


Protect Clean Water - Oppose legislation to undermine clean water protections (H.R. 3898)



HART'S HILL BROOK TROUT

One June 17, Hart's Hill Elementary third graders and their teachers released brook trout that they raised from fry this school year, in collaboration with our local Mohawk Valley Trout Unlimited Chapter. Throughout the year, third grade classroom teachers guided students to maintain and care for the young fish. Students learned about the life cycle of a brook trout, fed and cared for the fish, monitored pH levels, sampled nitrate and ammonia levels, recorded water temperature, documented growth and maintained observational records.

The students were able to interact with nature as well as the Trout Unlimited team. They enjoyed listening, answering questions and most importantly, had a blast releasing their very own Hart's Hill raised brook trout — or as students say, "Bart," "Gary," "Fred," etc.

A very special thank you to our amazing team of third grade teachers: Mrs. Huther, Mrs. Charlebois and Ms. Jerome for their efforts working with students, taking care of the trout and being the best. 
