


SAVE THE DATE! The 2026 CNY Fly Tying Symposium and Outdoor Celebration will be at Harts Hill, Whitesboro, NY

Hi All,

As we approach the Thanksgiving holiday, it's a great time to reflect on all the things for which we can be thankful. Whether it's health, family, freedom to pursue our interests and passions, or just living near so many great fishing opportunities. It's a good time to think about the things we care deeply about and how to keep them available for future generations.

The snow is already flying! What a change from the drought conditions of October. Lots of steelhead still around for those who don't mind braving the elements. For others, it's time to think about replacing the lost flies and tackle for next season. November is egg delivery time for our TIC volunteers. It's been a busy month of preparation and deliveries to area schools.

The chapter held a few interesting events recently, including a stream water sampling activity with ESF and fishing evening on Oneida Lake in October. We had a good turnout at the chapter meeting in November with presentations on TIC and the stream monitoring MVTURK project. We also held a, short notice, Redds (trout nest) survey on the Oriskany with a few potential sightings.

Engaging speakers are lined up for the December and January chapter gatherings. And we are also planning a Fishing Film Festival Night on January 29th. See the MVTU website for more event details and updates.

Steve Prievo recently summarized the financial state for the MVTU chapter and his report is presented below.

The board is currently refining our chapter strategic plan for the next few years. If you are interested in participating, please let us know.

#### Treasurer's Report

As we enter another cycle of Trout in the classroom and Chapter fundraising, it seems appropriate to review our previous efforts and successes. One member suggested that our future fundraising might benefit from publicizing the success of our efforts. First, I'd like to point out that the Chapter has adopted some new strategies, with a renewed emphasis on youth education, particularly Trout in the Classroom projects. We've updated our social media presence (website and Facebook), and we changed the format of our primary fundraising raffle and added a very successful Fly Tying Symposium. We set a goal of raising \$3000 for purchasing chillers for TIC projects. Ultimately, we raised a net amount of \$6808 in the past 10 months. In addition, \$500 was donated by a member in November of 2024, at the start of our planning. Even as we were in the middle of our planning the interest in TIC grew and the number of participating schools increased to 22, with 2 or 3 new schools starting TIC programs this year.

- We've purchased 10 chillers at a cost of \$6289.64, plus another \$245.08 in chemicals and miscellaneous supplies, bringing the total of TIC expenditures to \$6534.72. This doesn't include unrecorded member purchases of small items or contributions to bus trips.
- We've also given \$500 in student awards, \$300 to TU Trout Camp, and bought digital microscopes for the Stream Safari program (\$189.18).
- The Chapter has also begun a stream monitoring program and there will be
  equipment purchases associated with the growth of that program. The first two
  kits were provided by member purchases and equipment donations. A portion of
  next year's revenue will be allocated to that program.




