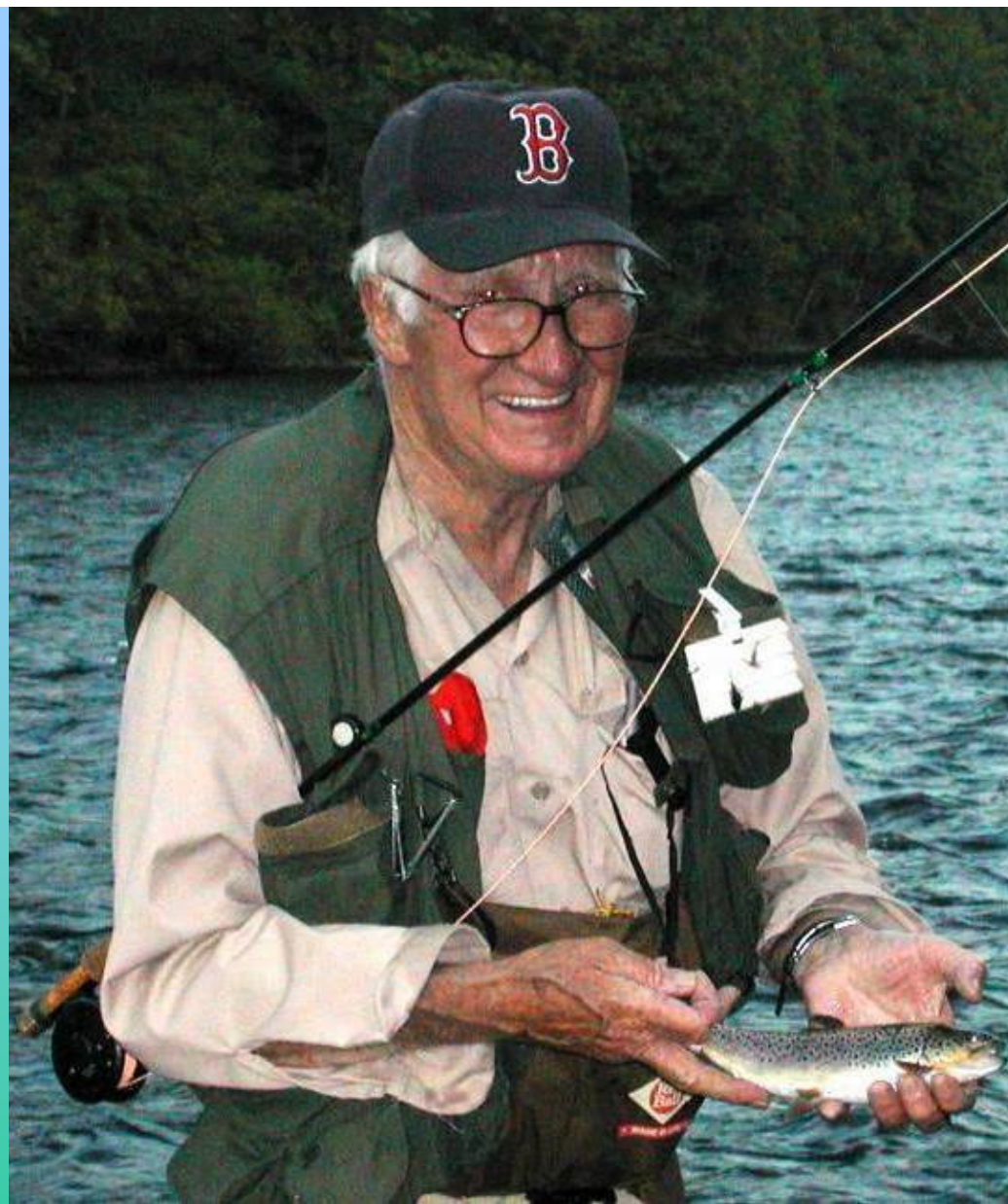




Fly Fishing the West Canada

It's not very famous



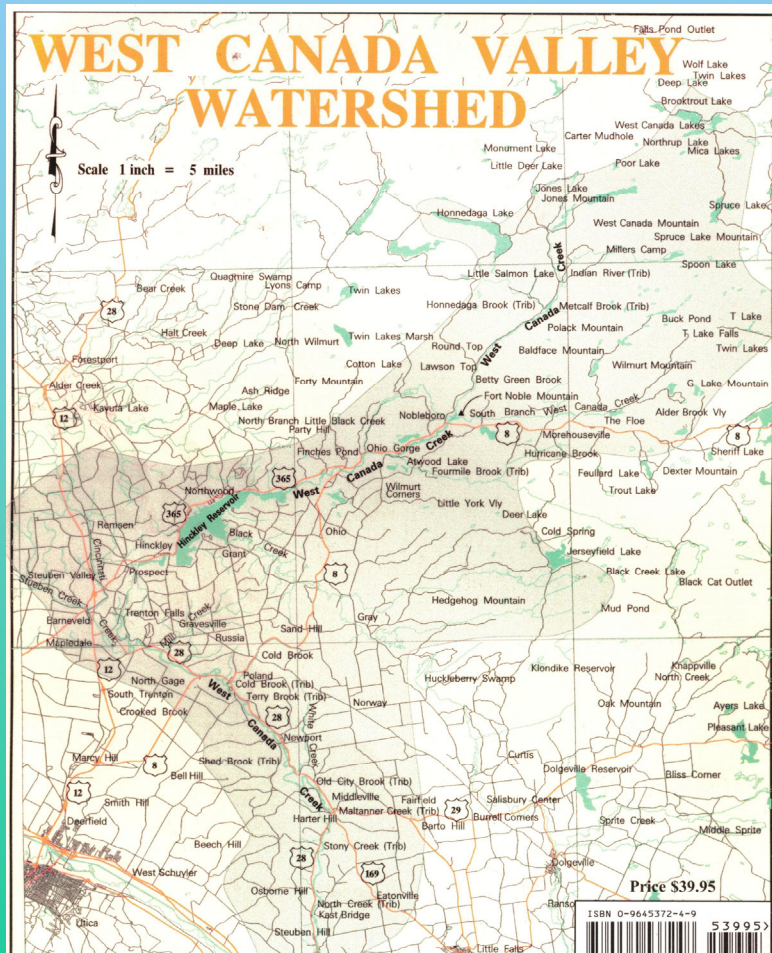
It's More Than Just a Creek

Hinckley Dam

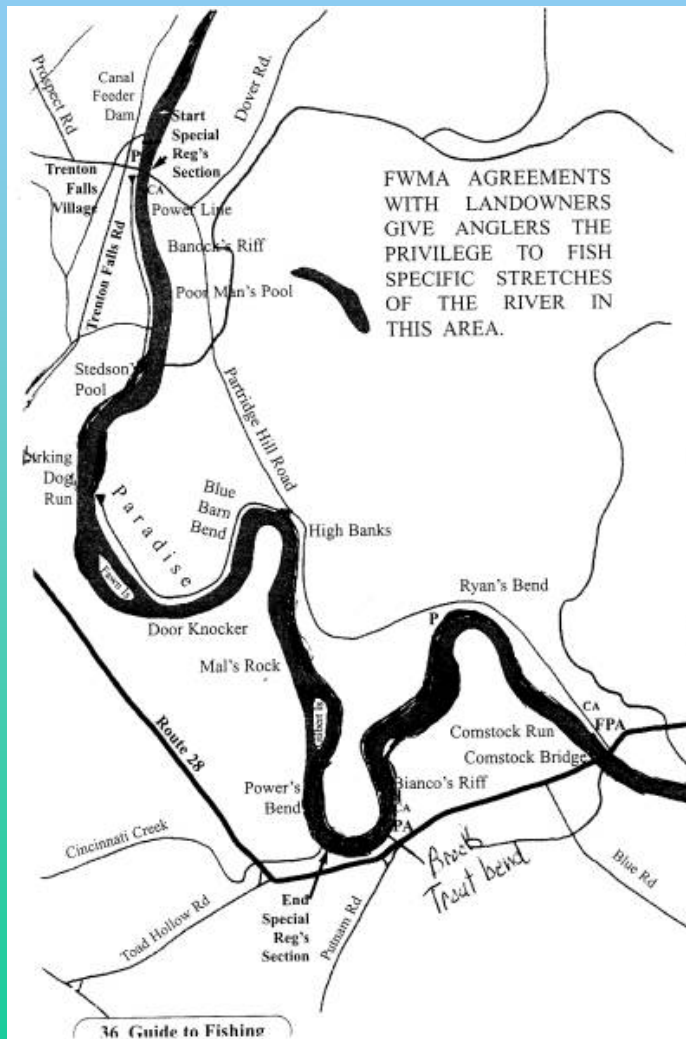


Brookies can be found above

The Catch and Release Area



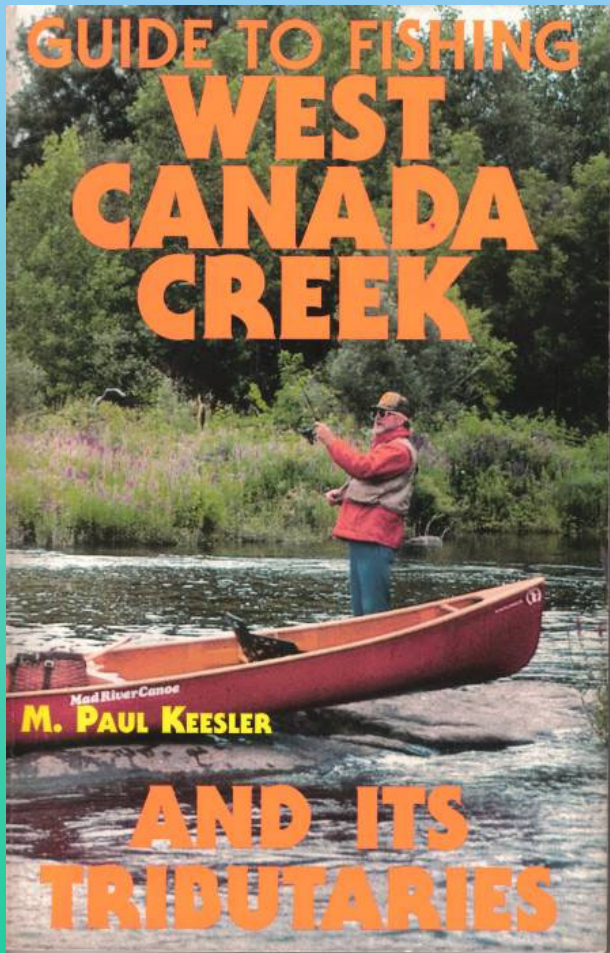
- Upper tail water

Know when it is too high



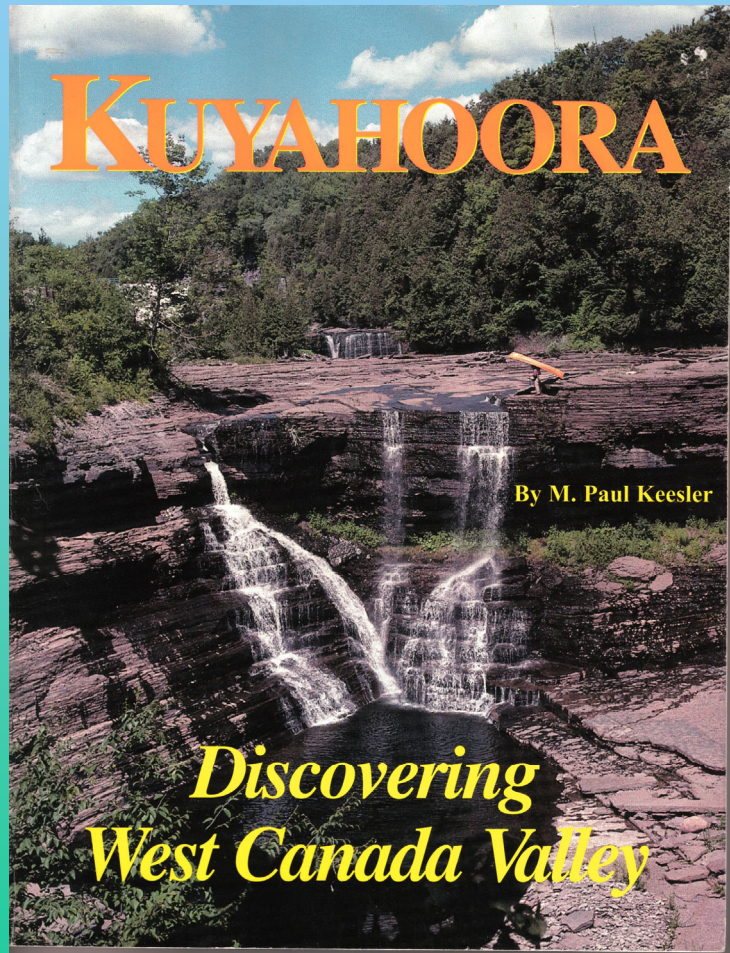


Learn the river

- Its history is interesting

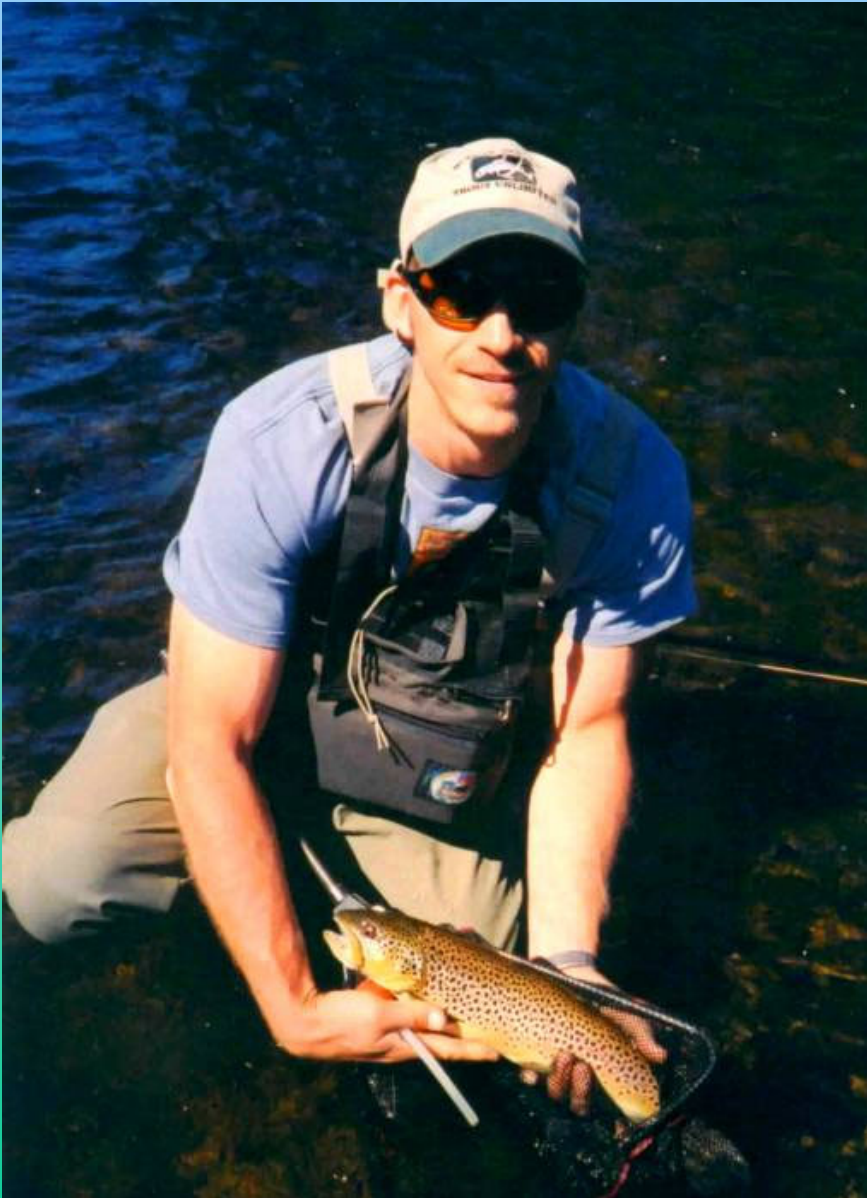




Typical brown
