

Trout in the Classroom has added many new volunteers this year as our program under Gary Bartell continues to expand. The schools are in the middle of their releases of the trout they have nurtured this school year. These are exciting events not only for the kids and teachers, but also for parents and grandparents that attend. The kids love it when family and friends show an interest in their studies. The future release dates are listed in this newsletter in hopes you can attend one that's close to home.

Our stream monitoring program led by Stu Miller is also gaining traction and training classes are listed if you are interested in participating. With funding cuts in certain programs, we feel that it is especially important now that as residents, we help wherever possible to protect our streams and wetlands. If our citizen science can help spot potential issues, it is worth it. DEC and other agencies do a great job, but they can always use a little help from the public. On May17th many brook trout fishers headed into distant ponds to help DEC place signage to help gather valuable information they will need to help them formulate the upcoming Brook Trout Pond Management Plan. These signs have a QR code that can link you through your phone to leave comments and questions regarding pond conditions. Your comments will help them decide what approach they should take to help preserve and protect our native brook trout populations in NY. Thank you to all that participated in this event.

We realize that in today's world it is not easy to find time to volunteer. Getting involved to whatever degree you can is what's important. Our recent tree planting on Sauquoit Creek was a good example. Folks that could help that day got 100 trees and shrubs planted in less than two hours. Volunteering with us is not a long-term commitment, unless you want it to be. Whatever time or support you can extend, whether it be manual labor or financial assistance, is much appreciated and does make a difference in helping to protect our local natural resources.

Temperature, Transparency, Biotic Index, Flow Rate, Dissolved Oxygen and Flow








Trout Waters Youth Camp








Paddlefest Old Forge


