**OUTREACH NEEDS YOUR HELP!** 

Did you know that the updated number for chronically undernourished people in the world is 780 million? This is a staggering number. Please mark your calendars to join us on March 9th from 1-3 pm for Outreach's meal packing event with RISE Against Hunger! At this March event we will be packing 10,152 meals in two hours. Each meal consists of rice, soy, dehydrated vegetables and a vitamin pack. The mission of RISE Against Hunger is to grow a global movement to end hunger by empowering communities: "Targeting remote, last mile communities within hunger pockets designated serious by the Global Hunger Index, (they) work with local leaders to harness the strengths of their communities and tackle their own food and nutrition



security challenges with agency, dignity and resistance." As the various links show, they work with local communities to help teach them agricultural methods to sustain themselves independently going forward. According to their 2022 Year End Report, RISE Against Hunger impacted 4.489,000 lives. They distributed 67.6 million meals to over 38 countries.

You asked us for a "hands-on" activity in Outreach. Here it is! But we need your help to make it a success. Let us join forces and harness the strength of our community. We will be reaching out for volunteers from the community. The Scouts have already expressed interest in joining us. (Having personally participated in such an event several years ago, I found it to be a great community building experience for all ages.) We welcome all volunteers from school age children on up. High School students are even eligible for service hours! There will be 6 meal packing stations, 4 weigh and seal stations where volunteers can be seated, and a box and counting station.


