#### Church Council

The Church Council met on September 15 via Zoom. Reverend Drury opened the meeting with prayer.

The upcoming Inviting and Welcoming events will be widely publicized in the community. On October 3 from 2:00-3:00 there will be a Blessing of the Animals, and on October 10 from 11:00-1:00 there will be a Chowder Fest and a talk by Ben Carnevale on his book Nobska. Volunteers are What We've Been Doing! needed to assist at these events. Please contact Greg Mills if you are available to help. Council world to recommend the wearing of modes at the inble to help. Council voted to recommend the wearing of masks at the indoor events.

The Treasurer's report showed that member support in August was considerably lower than in August 2020. However, the year-to-date totals were similar. Carol Mills noted that the trustees voted to pay for the solar project with unrestricted funds rather than borrowing funds for that purpose. Carol also distributed and reviewed the Proposed Spending Plan for 2022, which will be voted on at the fall meeting on October 24.

Council then heard reports from the church boards and committees. Archivist Jeannine Jeffrey will be collecting records of the Paul Revere Day event. The annual assembly of the Cape Cod Council of Churches will be held on September 30 via Zoom. A new chef has been hired for the Faith Family Kitchen, and A Baby Center is open by appointment only. The Board of Christian Education has posted the Director of Christian Education position. FCC Kids had a fun time playing games on the Green following the children's message on Rally Day. The Outreach Committee continues to coordinate with Habitat for Humanity to set up volunteer opportunities for our church to assist with its project in Falmouth, which may now begin in November. The Deacons will serve Communion in the traditional way, but kits will continue to be available in the pews. Offering plates are currently outside of each entrance to the sanctuary. The pads for writing prayer requests are once again available. Ushers and greeters are needed for Sunday services. The choir is now back singing. Steve Birmingham, Music Committee chairperson, plans to work with FCC Kids on a song for the Blessing of the Animals event. The Nominating Committee has begun looking for members to fill vacancies on our boards and committees. The Reception Committee will move fellowship time inside beginning on September 26. The Stewardship Campaign begins on October 17 and will conclude on November 7, Loyalty Sunday. Carolyn Dreyer, John Dulina, and Ernie and Barbara Kirsch will deliver stewardship moments. The Trustees are considering hiring a vendor to manage larger capital projects. This person would coordinate with a trustee project coordinator. The solar installation project is progressing well, and the steeple rehabilitation project remains a top priority. The Southern New England Conference of the UCC has issued a challenge to churches to become "green" to help combat climate change. Bobbie Miner, one of our delegates, is proud that we are already designated as a "green church," and in addition we are currently adding solar panels. Marcia Young,

#### **Under Construction...**

Two significant projects are underway now at the church:

- I) a standby "instant on" gas-fired generator is being installed to provide some back up power and prevent the sprinkler system from "faulting" during power outages and unnecessarily calling the fire department.
- 2) a solar panel or photovoltaic (PV) array is being installed on the east side of the Fellowship Hall roof that will cover almost all of our electrical needs.

These are being done at the same time as both systems will use the same trench to the front of the Church building to bring power to the main circuit boxes.

The generator effort should be completed the last week in September. The solar panels will also be fully installed by then as well but we will not be able to turn the system "on" until the electrical utility (Eversource) gives us the final approval.
