

Church Council

Reverend Drury opened the March 15th meeting of the Church Council with prayer. Jonathan said the church has been busy with Newcomers, the Garden Club, and Scouts meeting here and the Red Cross using our space for a blood drive. Jonathan recently attended a meeting of clergy from the Southern New England Conference of the UCC. He said that we are doing well compared to other churches. Palm Sunday will feature the palm parade and John Ruetters' *Requiem*, which will be performed from the front of the church. On Maundy Thursday, Communion will be served by intinction. Communion will also be served on Easter Sunday.

Tom Durham, Treasurer, said that member support in February totaled \$15,005 and year-to-date is \$87,174, which is

slightly lower than in 2022. The unrestricted gift of \$88,166 from the Mary Jean Howard Bequest of 2011, received in February, will be put into CDs to be used to help with the budget deficit.

Council then turned to reports from the church boards and committees. The Outreach Committee will partner with the Rotary Club to host an international banquet on Tuesday, May the 16th. This is a fundraiser for a group in Nepal and one in Guatemala City. Danielle Dallis said we are now connected to a foster family through the CCCC's

Covenant to Care for Foster Families program, and we will provide help as needs arise. On May the 27th we will host the CCCC's Youth Street Reach program, which hosts a breakfast for the homeless. On Easter Sunday there will be activities for the kids before the traditional egg hunt following the service. The Women's Union is planning a Rummage Sale for May the 6th. Our UCC Delegates will attend the April 23 meeting of the Barnstable Association and the annual meeting of the SNEUCC on June 17th in Worcester. The Trustees reported that progress continues on the steeple rehabilitation. Improvements to our storage spaces are also being made. The Deacons are reviewing the membership rolls, following the process outlined in our bylaws. The CCCC will hold its Generations of Hope – Jubilee 63 on April the 29th in Dennis Port. This event celebrates the sixty-third anniversary of the CCCC.

During the general discussion, Moderator Katie Dreyer announced that June 25th will be ONA Sunday. The ONA logo is being finalized, and we will hear more from a panel on how to be a welcoming church. Jan Hull is painting a celebratory sign for the wall of accolades which will be to the left of the church office. Katie attended board and committee meetings and met with people at the Enterprise and the Chamber of Commerce to discuss ways to enhance publicity. She also spoke to Eight Cousins about partnering on book talks. The meeting ended with Council members joining in the Lord's prayer.

A Brief Explanation of the Church's Investments, Investment Decisions, and Meeting a Deficit Budget

As most FCC members are aware, the First Congregational Church in Falmouth is fortunate to have substantial investments due to generous bequests to the church over the years. Some of these gifts were bequeathed with restrictions (specifically directing where the funds are to go) while others are unrestricted. As Treasurer, I think of these investments as our church's "Long-Term Savings Accounts," with the funds raised annually, including stewardship pledges and rental income, as our church's "Annual Operating Income."

Some have asked, "Why did we approve a \$68,000 deficit budget when the Church is so fortunate to have such large investment accounts?" The simple answer is: The amount we expect to receive in 2023 as "Annual Operating Income" is less than our church's expenses.

For at least the past 20 years, the church used money from the "Long-Term Savings Accounts" to balance the budget for Annual Operating Expenses and for Major Projects to maintain and improve our buildings and grounds. To meet our Annual Operating Expenses, the dollar amount taken from our investments has been \$75,000 to \$90,000 each year for the past 7 years. To pay the 2023 expenses, we will probably need to use an additional \$68,000 from our church's "Long-Term Savings Accounts."

FCC has an investment committee who, along with an investment advisor, makes recommendations on how to invest the money in the "Long-Term Savings Accounts" with the intention of attaining growth as a means of providing additional financial support to the mission, operation, and maintenance of the church. For money needed for current year expenses, we have money market accounts and recently invested in higher interest earning Certificates of Deposit.

Board of Christian Outreach

The Outreach Committee met in March and voted to make the following donations. A donation of \$1,000 was made to the Big Brothers Big Sisters of Cape Cod and the Islands. The mission of this nonprofit organization is to partner with under-resourced families to provide their children with transformational, one-to-one professionally supported relationships with caring adult mentors, so that their children will thrive. A donation of \$1,500 was made to the Cape Cod Council of Churches. The Council's mission is to serve the spiritual and physical needs of all people on Cape Cod and the Islands by engaging in and supporting ministries of ecumenical witness. It supports such programs as A Baby Center, Faith Family Kitchen Hope Food Pantry and Youth Street Reach. A donation of \$200 was made to Celebrations, an organization which provides funding for the Falmouth High School after prom event. Finally, a donation of \$1,500 was made to the Housing Assistance Corporation (HAC) whose mission is twofold: To deliver housing and services that meet the needs of the community and minimize our impact on natural resources; and to engage in responsible economic development that generate jobs, stabilize housing and strengthens the community. Everyone is invited to join members of the Outreach Committee (Team FCC) in the upcoming Housing Assistance Corporation's (HAC) annual Walk for Hope on Sunday, May 21st. We are excited to announce that this year our church will be a sponsor of this great event. By walking or donating, you will help support HAC's housing programs and services to give hope to our most vulnerable neighbors needing access to critical housing services. In 2022, HAC served over 6,200 clients through education, stabilization, prevention and services for the homeless. This year the Walk will be held in three different locations, Falmouth being one. If the date May 21st is not good for you, you can still be part of the team and walk whenever and wherever you want - on a treadmill, around your neighborhood, along the beach, on a bike path or in a park. If walking is not for you, donations to the team are also accepted.

Strategic Planning — Katie Dryer, Church Moderator, attended our March 8th meeting and sought from Trustees ideas for Strategic Planning efforts. This was part of Katie's efforts to visit our church's Boards and Committees to solicit ideas and comments for Strategic Planning for the church. We are grateful for Church Council approving a Strategic Planning effort and for Katie's willingness to lead this effort.

Scout Troop 42 — We are pleased to welcome Falmouth Scout Troop 42 and their families to use our Fellowship Hall Wednesday evenings 6:30 — 8:00 PM for their meetings. The Troop has a membership that has varied in recent years between 25 and 30 Scouts. They will begin their space use agreement the last week in March. We have arranged with them a parking plan that does not utilize parking spaces in our lot that are near the church, thus freeing those spaces for other meetings using church rooms other than Fellowship Hall. They do not meet during the summer months. Troop 42 is joining the Falmouth Cub Scout Pack 41, Falmouth Girl Scout Cadet Troop 82179 and Falmouth Brownie Troop 77470 who are using our facilities for their meetings. It is wonderful to have these vibrant groups of young people are using our church facilities.

Church Facilities and Grounds — Storage Space. Our church's Administrator Martha Evans, Site Manager James Rowland, and Supervisory Project Manager Brendan O'Hara completed an assessment of current storage spaces in the church. In the process they consulted with current users of storage spaces. They presented an efficient plan that involves shifting some existing storage materials to new spaces, modernizing some storage areas for greater efficiency with new shelving, and new storage cabinets in a few areas. As this report is being prepared, Brendan is in the process of obtaining and then providing Trustees with more details of the cost estimates of materials. Brendan has agreed to undertake the project given the sensitivity of timing for the project to be interfaced with various uses of some of the storage areas or adjacent areas. We extend our appreciation for their efforts to Martha, James, and Brendan!

Other Facilities and Grounds Projects. It is our responsibility to keep the congregation informed as projects are considered, planned, pursued and finished, without overloading you with details and repetition. We highlight a few of the several ongoing projects that are in progress by our Supervisory Project Manager, Brendan O'Hara, at the request of the Trustees. Brendan met with the Falmouth Building Commissioner to discuss the structural aspects of the ongoing Steeple Restoration and Rehabilitation Project. He is obtaining additional engineer feedback for engineering drawings. The process of arranging for scaffolding estimates, interviewing prospective contractors, and obtaining new estimates is in progress. These are needed for planning and also for preparing proposals to both local and national sources of partial funding for which our church is eligible as a site on the National Historic Register. Trustees Greg Mills and John Farrington will be coordinating the submission of those proposals.

We are aware that the fire escape on the parking lot side of the church, opposite the manse, needs sanding and repair. We are preparing for appropriate interactions with the Falmouth Historical Commission before proceeding further with planning repairs or replacement.

<u>Livestreaming and Online Meeting Room</u>. Both the livestreaming for the Sanctuary and the Online Meeting Room continue to be used productively thanks to Hal Petersen and the Live Streaming crew of Brennan Carlson, Linda Church, Gideon Drury and John Honey. The Online Meeting Room is available to be scheduled by appropriate groups with needs consistent with our church's mission. Trustee Hal Petersen has begun the process of what would be needed to bring Online Meeting capabilities to Fellowship Hall. This is another potential strategic planning topic.

<u>Church Grounds</u>. During the next several weeks, Trustees will be taking their annual walk around the church grounds to assess needs for the church grounds and other outside facilities. We are cognizant of the need for major projects in this category to be discussed within the context of the church's ongoing strategic planning process.
