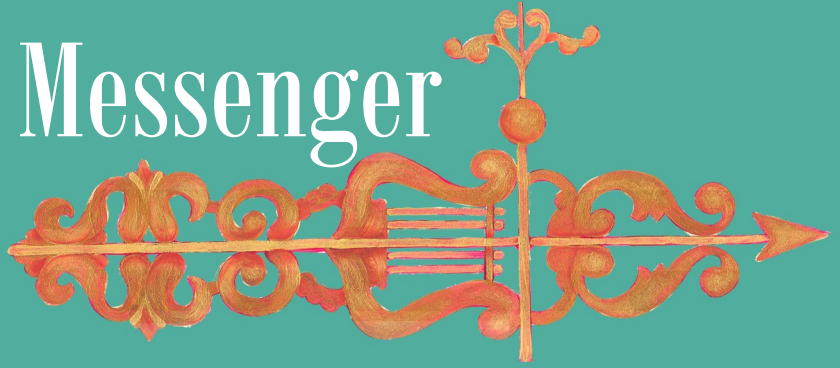

From Christian Outreach...

The Outreach Committee met in November and voted to make the following donations. A donation of \$500. was made to the No Guff Week in Falmouth. This program sponsored by the Falmouth Public Schools district promotes the idea of inclusion, positivity and kindness. Students pledge during the week to not speak or text anything negative about others. These valuable messages are as relevant today as they were back in 2001 when No Guff was created by Greg Gilbert. Additionally, the congregation collected \$460. for our Neighbor's in Need Special Mission Offering held in October. The focus for this year's campaign was on 'the unhoused aka homelessness'.

The local Habitat for Humanity chapter is breaking ground very soon on 6 homes in East Falmouth. Habitat is hoping to have all the Faith Communities in Falmouth collectively contribute \$55,000, an amount sufficient to construct one of these homes. As such, the Outreach Committee voted to offer a matching grant program to our Congregation, in which Outreach, with its funds, will match all amounts contributed by Members, up to \$2,000. This program will run until December 12, 2021. Interested persons should make out a check to the Church with "Habitat Matching Grant" written in the Memo field. We hope this challenge will help make the promise of affordable housing in Falmouth for some lucky families a reality.

We are currently seeking donations for the Afghan Refugee Families. We recently received word that an Afghan Refugee Family of 8 (4 adults and 4 children) will soon be arriving in Falmouth. We are seeking donations to assemble Personal Hygiene Kits for this family of 8 as well as the two other families who soon will follow. These welcoming kits

Church Council

Reverend Drury opened the November 17th Council meeting with prayer. He said that the church has been very busy. There have been several memorial services in the last few weeks, and more have been scheduled. The Solar Energy Celebration was well attended, and the Chili Fest and Nathaniel Philbrick's discussion of his latest book *Travels with George* will round out this fall's Inviting and Welcoming Initiative events. Jonathan noted that we will have a deficit budget next year and that conversations should take place around fund raising sources. Currently our main source is rental of our space.

Council approved a recommendation from the Deacons that the pulpit gate, which the Falmouth Historical Society recently returned to the church, be hung on the left side wall as one enters Fellowship Hall.

Planning for the Christmas services has begun. The church will be open for carols and readings before and after the Lighting of the Green on December 4. There will be two services on Christmas Eve, with the 5:30 family service including a pageant. The Messiah Sing will not take place this year, as the orchestra is not available.

The Treasurer's report showed that member support in October was almost \$3,000 lower than last year at this time, possibly due to the cancellation of two worship services in October. Total expenses were slightly higher due to higher expenses for grounds maintenance.

Council then heard reports from the church boards and committees. Records of the Paul Revere Bell event will be filed in our Archives. Our Cape Cod Council of Churches' delegate, Lee Campbell, noted that there will be a Homeless Persons' Memorial Service on December 12 and a Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Commemoration Service on January 16 in Hyannis. The Board of Christian Education is working with John Dulina on new ideas for the Christmas pageant. Danielle Dallis is fully involved as Director of FCCKids. The Outreach Committee is collecting personal hygiene products to create kits for Afghan refugee families who will be arriving in Falmouth soon. The Deacons heard a report from Laura Cole about the effects these uncertain times are having on people. Martine Bindler-Desbiens was commended for sending hand-made cards to our members who are experiencing joy or loss. Steve Birmingham, Music Committee chair, hopes to keep singing with the kids and is currently planning for the Christmas pageant. The Nominating Committee continues its work to fill vacancies on our boards and committees. The Reception Committee will prepare the beverages for fellowship hour with church committees providing goodies. Stewardship materials which were not picked up have been mailed out. The Trustees are working with Coastal Engineering on an inspection to determine the short, medium, and long term needs of the steeple. UCC Delegate Bobbie Miner encouraged the committees to use the resources of our conference. Nine people attended the Women's Union meeting in November. WU will meet again in January for a lunch at the church.

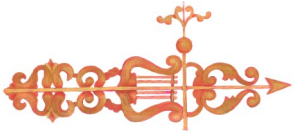
