The Outreach Committee met in December and voted to make the following donations. A donation of \$500 was made to No Place for Hate for their Martin Luther King breakfast, promoting equity and inclusion. The mission of this Falmouth community organization is to build bridges, combat violence based on race, sexual orientation, gender identity or expression and religion. Their aim is to promote respect for all people through advocacy and education. A donation of \$500 was made to HAC (Housing Assistance Corporation) to purchase gift cards for the homeless. HAC's mission is to deliver housing and services that meets the needs of the community and to engage in responsible economic development that generates jobs, stabilizes housing and strengthens the community. HAC operates homeless shelters for adults and families, administers rental subsidies, offers education and training and develops new affordable housing. Finally, a donation of \$680 was made to SNEUCC. This regional Association of the Massachusetts UCC Conference provides counsel, programs and support to its local churches.

We are happy to report that the Alternative Gift Market made approximately \$36,000 this year! After two years of running the market virtually due to COVID, this year both options of shopping in person or online were offered. Thank you for your support of this important ministry during the holidays.
