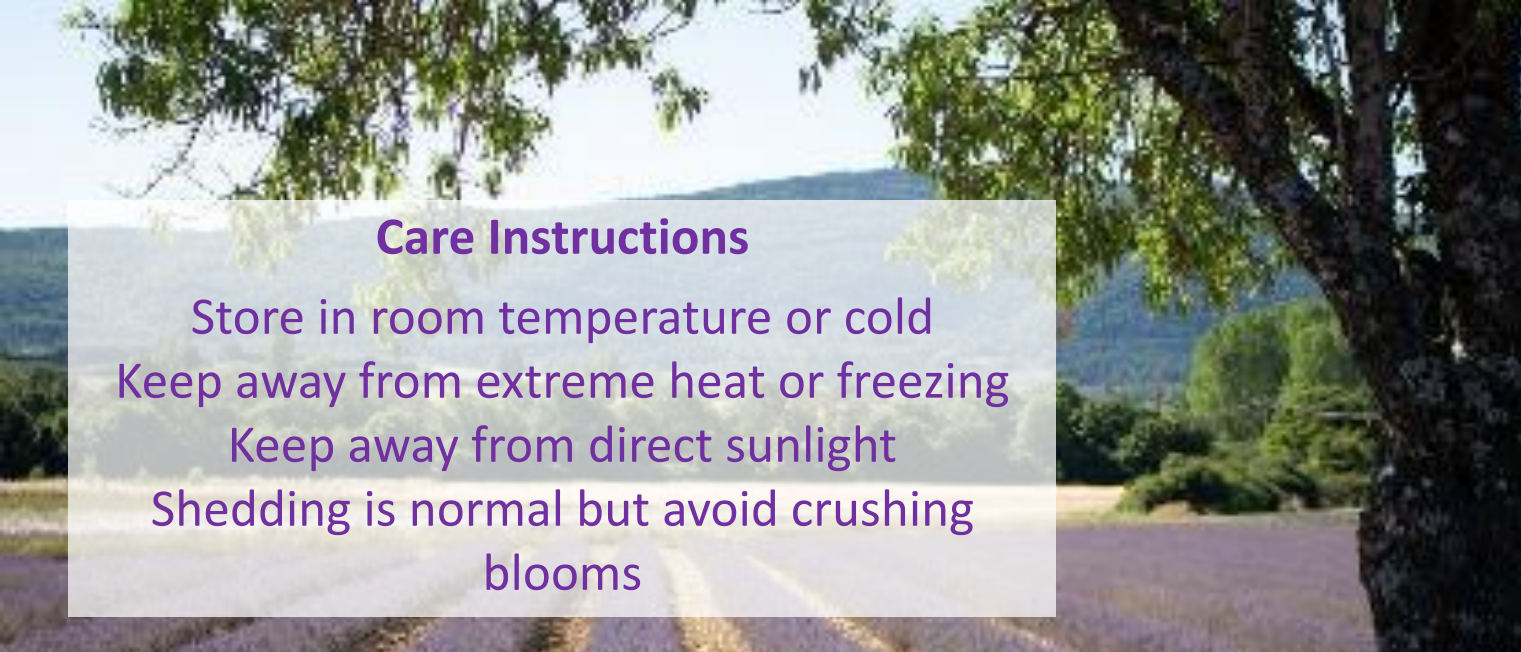

The dried buds have a fragrance of their own. As it fades add a few drops of essential oil to refresh the scent if needed

Bath salts are a great way to relax and easy to make! Combine 1 ¼ cups Epsom salt, ¼ cup dried lavender buds, and 7-10 drops of lavender essential oil. Store the bath salts in a mason jar with the lid secured tightly and enjoy for up to six months!

## Gifting

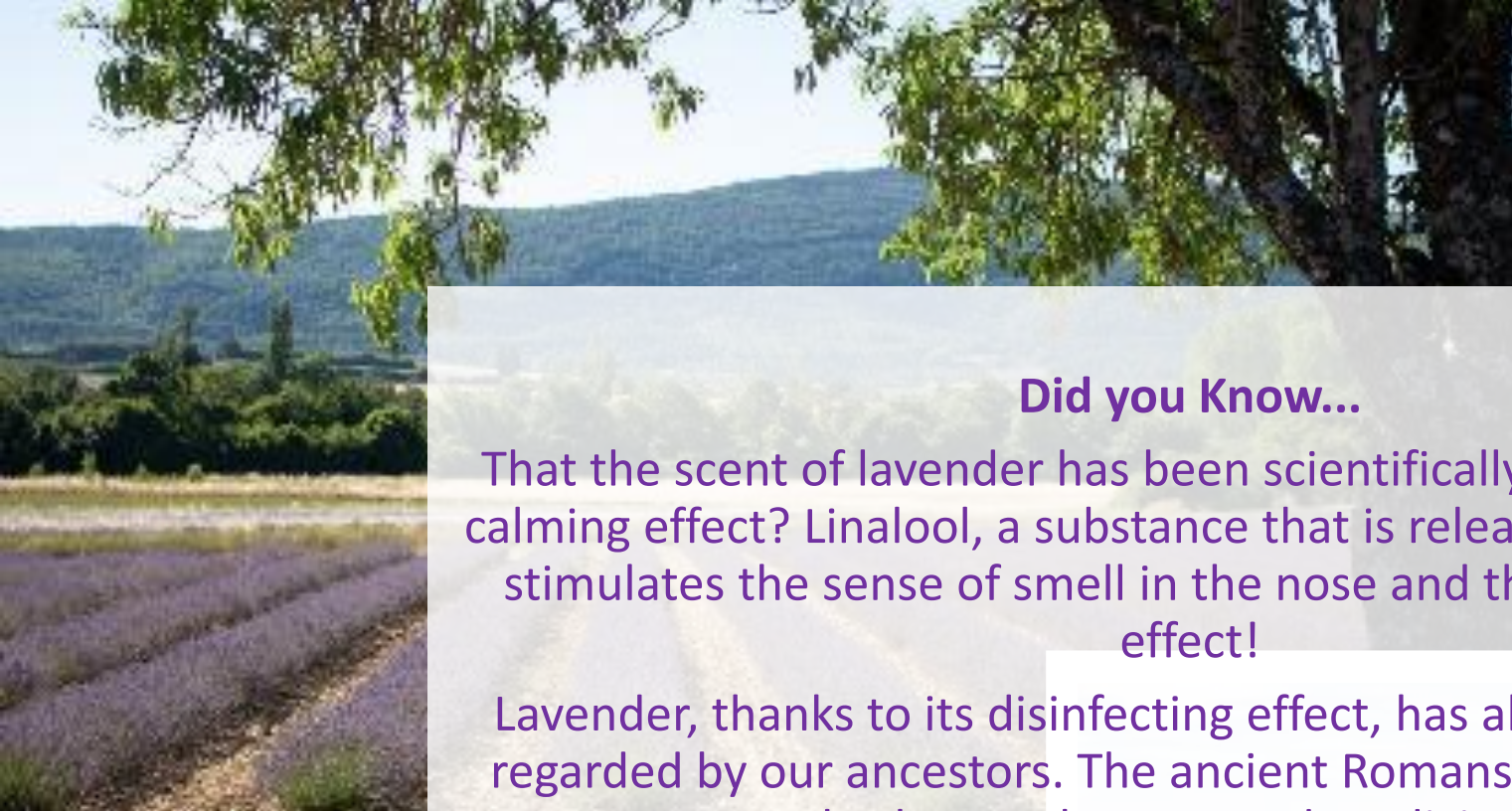
Add a few sprigs to your gift wrap for a personalized touch sure to win over the recipient.
