

- Year 1878: Intensive exploration of the land acquired by Mu the guidance of H. Gribble Turner of the Madras Civil Service A. W. Turner. Lands are offered for cultivation and a nucleus lab from the plains of Tamil Nadu to start a cinchona plantation Devikulam Estate.
- Year 1879: Munro obtains the second Pooniat Concession. I Land Planting and Agricultural Society are founded to which conveyed.
- Soon...tracts are opened in the Hills in Cinchona and Sisal.
- Year 1880: The first tea is planted in Parvathi Estate (a part of Estate) by A.H. Sharp.
- Year 1886: An expedition in 1886 to the foothills by a new and from Top Station in Chittavurral to Korangani is made in search connection is forged with the famous Suppan Chetty to send up head-loads of cinchona bark. Thus a new chapter in trade operatives as the path for a ropeway.
- Soon...bridle paths spread in various directions are made. P bullocks carrying up rice and taking the hill produce down become Hills.
- Year 1888: The Kanan Devan Planters Association is formed.





For the summer TigerPaws is conducting Himalayan treks in Himachal Pradesh, as well as overlanders once again in India's north east.






In February, we participated in the Pacific Area Travel Agents Association International meet which had the Responsible Tourism Theme. Our credentials in this sphere were visible for all to see.
