



Franklinton

Senior quarterback, Jacob Crain leads the offense for the Demons. He will look to be efficient in his last warm-up before week one. It will be important for the Demon offensive line to show that they can handle a team like Mandeville up front. The Skippers also have talent in the secondary, which should be a good challenge for receiver DaMikies McClain and the rest of the receivers. On defense, the Demons get to face a three-year starting quarterback in Ben Hendricks. The defensive front seven for the Demons is big and experienced. They will get a good chance to see where they stack up against Mandeville's running game and new running back Jax Oquin. The secondary is experienced and has one of the best in the area in Chakyn McClain. They will look to contain the Mandeville passing game and playmaking receiver Jake Jacketti.
