# MetroParks to Host Educator Workshops in 2020

Do you have a passion for teaching? A passion for all things WILD? MetroParks of Butler County is partnering with Butler County Soil and Water Conservation District to facilitate not one, but two Project WILD workshops this year.

So what is Project WILD? Project WILD is a blanket term for all the educational programs that it encompasses, which include Growing Up WILD (students PreK – 3<sup>rd</sup> grade), Curious KIDSS (K – 2<sup>nd</sup> grade), Aquatic WILD (K – 12<sup>th</sup> grade), and of

course, Project WILD (K – 12<sup>th</sup> grade). These programs are "interdisciplinary conservation and environmental education program[s] emphasizing wildlife. The goal of Project WILD programs is to assist learners of any age in developing awareness, knowledge, skills, and commitment resulting in informed decisions, responsible behavior, and constructive actions concerning wildlife and the environment" [1]. Launched in 1983, Project WILD started as a joint project between the Council for Environmental Education (CEE) and the Western Association of Fish and Wildlife Agencies (WAFWA). The Association of Fish and Wildlife Agencies (AFWA) took over Project WILD in 2017 [2]. They partner with state agencies, such as the Ohio Department of Natural Resources – Division of Wildlife for the state of Ohio program, in order to train volunteer facilitators, provide the educational activity guides and resources, and become a more local source of Project WILD information.

The primary audience of Project WILD is educators of school-aged children. The educational guides (provided free of charge by the ODNR – Division of Wildlife) contain educational activities on conservation and wildlife that the workshop participants can take back to their PreK-12 students (grade level depends on which workshop is attended). Essentially, the goal of the workshop is to provide the WILD training to educators so they can teach the curriculum to their students. About Project WILD, long-time facilitator Lynn White of Butler County Soil and Water Conservation District says, "Workshops like Project WILD are extremely important to provide educators with the resources to teach their students how to think and not what to think. I believe that informed students are the most likely to participate in the decision-making programs and to make a difference through their actions."

If you are an educator (or know an educator) and this sounds like a WILD time to you, we are holding the following workshops in 2020, both at Voice of America MetroPark:

- The first of these is a combined Project WILD and Aquatic WILD workshop on Saturday, February 29<sup>th</sup> from 9:00am to 3:30pm.
- The second is a Growing Up WILD workshop on Saturday, November 7<sup>th</sup> from 9:00am to 12:00pm.

#### Wildflower Corner



What is rarer than a 4-leaf clover? How about a 4-leaf sessile trillium? For a plant named for having parts in multiples of three it seems strange to find one with 4 leaves. Also known as a toadshade, this harbinger of spring is easy to tell from other trilliums because its maroon flower lacks a stalk (you might say it has a neck like a wrestler). The flower is foul smelling, since pollinators include flies and beetles.

This perennial wildflower is native to the central part of the eastern US. It is most commonly found in moist woodlands, flood plains, limestone woods, and along fence rows. Flowers normally appear from April to June.

There are some published reports of using cooked greens from this plant as an emergency food. Since the entire plant, especially the root causes vomiting, the wise reader is advised to seek elsewhere for his woodland snack. The fruit is considered a suspected poison. A more likely use of the plant involves its medicinal benefits. Treatment of tumors or as a poultice to cure boils have been reported. Just remember that picking wildflowers in MetroParks is not allowed.


