Since the early 1990's MetroParks has managed this 352-acre park area, nestled in the Elk Creek Valley, under agreement with the City of Middletown, which developed the park in the 1970's. In the Fall of 2014 ownership of Sebald Park was transferred to MetroParks by means of a purchase agreement with the City of Middletown.

This beautiful natural setting provides views of the wooded hills forming the walls of the creek valley while the open lawn areas of the park serve as recreation space for visitors using the park's 11 covered picnic shelters and three play areas for children. Hiking trails are routed throughout the woods and along Elk Creek, which runs the length of the park. For the horse back riders, the Horse Trail at Sebald Park offers 9.5 miles of trails that are designed for both the beginning and the seasoned riders. Come on ride on Butler County's only public horse riding trails!

All Members of Friends of MetroParks of Butler County are welcome to attend.

Amazing what changes in our parks our parks from week to week and month to month. My wife and I decided to take a quick hike at Dudley Woods a few days ago. Checking back our last visits there were the wildflower walk in April, and fighting invasive plants in May. What a transformation over the summer, the picnic shelter has been reroofed, over 30 thorny honey locust trees were removed from around the shelter and the cabin, trails were moved, and a new trail was established. The stream bank restoration was almost unnoticeable. Fall blooming wildflowers were seeking sunlight everywhere along the trails. Beautiful stands of vellow wingstem and blue great lobelia lined the trails that had been cleared of honeysuckle.



Critter Corner By Christine Gates

Finding a luna moth (Actias luna) is always a cause for excitement! Although common in Ohio, they are rarely seen because luna moths live only a single week as adults. The moth pictured (above/below) was found at Chrisholm MetroPark, and is a perfect example of a male luna moth. Males and females look very similar, but males have larger, bushier antennae. After hatching from eggs, luna moths spend about a month as large green caterpillars before forming a cocoon. Luna cocoons are able to wiggle and make noise to scare away predators. After two weeks the adult emerges, ready to find a mate. Luna moths are most often seen on summer nights, so keep an eye out if you happen to be near the woods!



Description: This eclipse is the fourth and last in a tetrad, a series of **four consecutive** total lunar eclipses in 2014 - 2015.

The term Blood Moon has recently become popular when referring to the total lunar eclipses in the 2014 - 2015 lunar tetrad. While the term has no technical or astronomical basis, many people believe that it comes from the Bible, and that the occurrence of the lunar tetrad is a fulfillment of a biblical prophecy.


