## Salamander Run Hike, October 8, 2016

Thank you to Eric Hollins for leading this guided trek over the varied terrain and habitat at Salamander Run, managed and currently owned by Three Valley Conservation Trust. We greatly enjoyed this beautiful fall day hike while learning of the restoration efforts, wildlife and native species to be found at this soon to be Butler County MetroPark. Restoration efforts have included the development on several vernal pools for amphibians, many acres of invasive plant removal and control, acres of native prairie plantings and over 11,000 seedling trees planted. During our visit during the Biggest Week of Birding in Butler County last May over 80 species of birds were identified on our morning hike.



Thousands of wet feet plugs have been planted in the newly developed vernal pools over the past two years. During 2015 and 2016 volunteers helped plant over 11,600 trees at Salamander Run.
