Recycling More in 2019:

Recycling reduces landfill waste, saves energy, and prevents pollution. In addition to recycling common household products such as paper, aluminum, and plastic bottles other items like compact fluorescent lightbulbs, printer ink cartridges, rechargeable batteries, and old electronics can be recycled too. It is important to remember that electronic devices contain metals that can be harmful to the environment if they're left in landfills.

CFL Lightbulb and Batteries

Even though compact fluorescent lightbulbs (CFLs) save energy, they release small amount of mercury when broken. Therefore, CFLs must be properly disposed to reduce mercury exposure. You can take them to any Lowes, Home Depot, or Batteries Plus Bulbs for free recycling.

Rechargeable batteries cannot be placed in your recycling bin, since they contain a variety of hazardous materials that cannot be recycled in the same facilities as most house hold products.

Batteries Plus Bulbs (located in West Chester, Hamilton, and Cincinnati), and Cohen (located in Hamilton and Middletown) will accept all batteries.

Ink Cartridges

Ink cartridges can be recycled for their plastic, and ink to make new products. This common office item is easily recycled by simply dropping off at a variety of retail stores such as, Staples, Office Max, Best Buy, Walmart, and Office Depot. Staples and Best Buy will even offer \$2 off your next purchase of ink cartridges.

Old Technology

Stores such as Best Buy and Staples offer a free recycling service for most used electronic items. Table 1 displays common electronic devices and where they should be recycled.

Butler County Recycling and Solid Waste District has their own website to assist in finding a local place to recycle different products and materials. Go to www.butlercountyrecycles.org and click on 'Search: How to Recycle Specific Items'. Once you type in the item you want to recycle it will bring up a list of local businesses that will recycle the item for you for free or for a fee. It is a good idea to call a business before you drop off items to recycle to confirm they recycle it, and if there is a fee.

We use electronics in our everyday lives, so it is important to know where to properly dispose of these products to reduce landfill, decrease the amount of harmful metals and plastics into the environment, and have material reused to make new products.




