- Keep up with vaccinations and deworming. Puppy's schedule is vaccinated at 8, 12, and 16 weeks old

- Know emergency signs: vomiting, diarrhea, not eating, low energy, pale gums. Learn what to do in case your puppy has an issue.

3. Safe Environment

- Puppy-proof your home (remove cords, small objects, and toxic plants).
- Slock access to stairs, pools, and dangerous areas.
- Provide a warm, soft bed in a quiet spot.

4. Training & Socialization

- Start potty training early with consistency.
- Keep young puppies in a secure playpen for their safety, so they can learn where it is okay to play, potty, and sleep safely. Take the puppy out for short times to interact with you and your family. It is also a way to train them if you want them to learn to potty outside. Short times out after eating, then take them out to potty, then back to the playpen. Establish a routine.
- See Use positive reinforcement (treats, praise).
- Socialize with other dogs and people (after vaccinations). Be careful, other dogs aren't too big for your baby or aggressive.
- Start basic commands: sit, come, stay.

5. Daily Routine

- Stick to a consistent schedule (feeding, potty, play).
- Puppies need 12–18 hours of sleep a day.
- Margin Gentle walks, playtime, and mental stimulation are key.

6. Emergency Contacts

- Know your **local emergency vet**. Keep the emergency number posted in your house so you can easily reach it in case of an emergency.
