Local Authorities' Requirements for Reporting of 2025 Building Official Appointments

[*The Construction Codes Act*](#) requires local authorities to report the status of their building official appointments from the previous fiscal year to the Chief Codes Administrator every year.

Within 60 days after the end of a local authority's fiscal year (by the end of February), the local authority must provide:

- The **name and licence number** of **every building official** who, in the **previous fiscal year (January 1 to December 31, 2025)**:
 - Was appointed
 - Had their appointment cancelled
 - Had their appointment suspended

Local authorities can use this convenient online form to submit the information. This is faster and easier than emailing or mailing it to Building and Technical Standards.
