

CASE MANAGEMENT

This year has offered many successes. We have celebrated a graduate from the program while supporting several thriving residents. The journey is not one of ease, but it is rewarding beyond measure. We have expanded our programming, creating more opportunities for each resident as she navigates her time at the LifeHouse. Domestic violence and sexual abuse create an uphill climb for these women. Our comprehensive medical team has helped transform our residents' Physical well-being. The donated dance studio has provided a resource for daily exercise and body connectivity. Restoring former images of brokenness and bondage with freedom in movement.

Mental therapies are plentiful, and there is an aggressive pursuit to find the best resource for each resident. Trauma-informed therapists meet individually and offer group sessions. Therapists equip each resident with daily and weekly skill-building tools. Animals have been introduced as comforting non-verbal companions. Neurofeedback is an emerging non-invasive treatment offered for individuals with PTSD. As the residents blossom, they are integrated into the community through volunteerism. As they connect with their community, they discover more of their interests. This has helped set future goals The LifeGuard Group can help residents reach. Established partnerships have opened educational and job training opportunities. Looking into 2025, our goals are broad. We want to expand on the services currently provided. We aim to serve more women on-site through transitional housing. Outreach programs for survivors and their families are being developed. While challenges remain, our commitment to providing a safe, empowering environment continues to yield positive outcomes. We couldn't do it without the support of our volunteers, donors, and community supporters. Together, we are able to continue our mission to RESPOND, RESCUE, RESTORE, and REVIVE for years to come.

MISSING PERSON SEARCHES





We received eight calls from individuals with missing family members. (The remaining three calls did not meet our search criteria, as the families did not provide us with the necessary information to search.



Lasted 9 months and the missing person was found deceased

VICTORY NOTES

One particular case will stay in my heart forever. I was handed a message that a father had called the office, and his daughter and grandchild had been missing for months. I called the father and assured him we would not give up until they were found. Over the next few weeks, we scoured social media, talked to family and friends, and with the help of our resources, "T" was found. With tears in our eyes, we watched as "T" was reunited with her father. When we arrived at the location to reunite this precious family, I witnessed her father run out to meet his daughter and grandchild; I watched as this large, fit man fell to his knees on the hot pavement and began to weep. After a long embrace, this man came and hugged me tight, and through his tears, he said, "Thank you for saving them, thank you for caring". This story and many more are the reason we keep searching!


