



The ***Companion Animal Cancer and Referral Center of Toronto (CACRC)*** is seeking applications for a board-certified small animal internist to provide clinical services and support for our speciality practice. The successful applicant will join our team of veterinary specialists offering services in 24/7 emergency medicine, critical care, oncology, radiology and diagnostic imaging, neurology, cardiology, and surgery.

The CACRC is currently under construction with a goal to open mid-2018. When fully complete, the CACRC will be a state of the art facility with advanced imaging including CT, 3Tesla MRI and PET Imaging. CACRC will be introducing a linear accelerator for radiation oncology. Advanced surgical equipment will include surgical planning, digital microscopy and navigation tools from Synaptive Medical. Photodynamic therapy will be available on site. A full range of flexible and rigid endoscopic equipment will be available. Cardiac ultrasounds will be performed by a boarded cardiologist and abdominal ultrasounds will be performed by board-certified specialists.

The CACRC mandate is to increase the quality of care for companion animals through knowledge transfer among and between human and veterinary clinicians, together creating leading patient care outcomes. We will adopt a team-based approach to offer compassionate treatment, offering novel protocols and therapeutics. We have established a joint comparative oncology program which will encompass radiology, radiation, surgery and pathology. There will be ample opportunities for research-oriented clinicians to be involved in clinical research with thought leaders in both veterinary and human medicine.

CACRC is centrally located adjacent to one of the City's most beautiful and prestigious neighbourhood's – the Bridle Path. CACRC is located just South-East of the junction of the 401/404/DVP, all areas of the City are within quick access.

Toronto is a thriving multi-cultural metropolitan city, amazing to wander through and discover. The sights, sounds and smells of the city are quite remarkable.
