MEET YOUR COMMITTEE CHAIRS

Lester Craft - Membership: "Our goal is to have each club in the district to have sufficient membership to fulfill our "Friend of Youth" motto, and to be able to accomplish other needed projects in the community,

O.I. has determined over the years that the most successful means of securing new members is for each Optimist to - Just Ask Someone! Another alternative is the NOW program which has been very successful in securing new members."

Each club is charged with working diligently to increase membership this year.

Ben Spradley - Youth Clubs: "Did you know that building a youth club satisfies Distinguished Club requirements? Youth clubs can be built at almost any age level. Youth clubs can fill a need to help your club operate its programs and activities". So what are you waiting for - start building a youth club!

Jerry Medlin - Junior Golf: "The club eliminations will be held this spring with the District eliminations scheduled for early June. The winner goes on to the World Tournament at PGA National in Palm Beach Gardens, Florida on July 12-22, 2001. Both boys and girls are eligible and I encourage all clubs to start early to secure candidates for the tournament".

Carlton Baird- Club Services and Tracking: "The purpose of this committee is to foster and enable the district to have healthy clubs. Emphasis is placed on the prevention of problems and identification of clubs that may need assistance and recommending activities and programs which may aid in correcting these problems." NORTH CAROLINA OPTIMIST LICENSE PLATE PROGRAM

A proposal was made at the District Convention to explore the possibility of applying to the State Department of Motor Vehicles to have a North Carolina license plate issued with the O.I. Friend of

Youth logo.

A minimum of 300 applications must be attained in order for the license plate to be produced. The cost is an additional \$10.00 per year over and above the cost of a regular plate.

CLUB HAPPENINGS...

Golden Circle, Wilson held their installation banquet this month with Jerry Godwin, Clinical Resources Manager at Wilson Memorial Hospital as guest speaker. Later this month, about 10 members will be ushering at the Edna Boykin Center/Show Shangri La Acrobats. Of immediate concern is that the club has dropped 11 members and possible even more to come. Club growth will be critical issue this year in order to regain the Honor Club status, which eluded them last year. Their first project of the year is "Youth Appreciation".

Laurinburg Optimist Club held their 39th Annual installation banquet at St. Andrews Presbyterian College with about 150 in attendance. They are looking forward to a special event next year as they celebrate their 40th anniversary.

They will be sponsoring a youth basketball team through the YMCA, and when you get to the State Fair this year be sure to stop at their concession stand behind Dorton Arena.
