


### Boys & Girls Homes of North Carolina

#### ORATORICAL CONTEST

TOPIC: "Why Me, Why Not"

**WHO IS ELIGIBLE:** Contestants shall be under the age of 16 as of December 31 of the 2007-08 school year and must be educated in the United States, Canada, or the Caribbean. There is no minimum age. Boys and girls will compete in separate contests.



**LENGTH OF SPEECH:** The speech must be at least 4 minutes but not over 5 minutes in length.

**IMPORTANT DATES:** The names of the zone contest winners must be provided to the District contest Chair by **April 15, 2008**. Also by **April 15, 2008**, the following documents must be provided to the District contest chair:

- 1. Copy of the application
- 2. Copy of the applicant's proof of age
- 3. A typed, double-spaced copy of the speech

The District oratorical contest will be held on **May 10, 2008** at the 3<sup>rd</sup> quarter District meeting in Roanoke Rapids.

**SCHOLARSHIP AMOUNT**: NC East District will award two \$1500 scholarships, one each to a boy and girl District winner.

Helpful hints for obtaining contestants can be found on page 39 of district handbook.

Suggestion: Find individuals who work with young people (church, school or parents who home school) on a regular basis, or who have demonstrated a willingness to work with youth, and get these individuals involved.
