



Childhood Cancer Campaign

This year's Childhood Cancer Campaign is off to a good start. The Duplin Optimist Club has held its first "Kisses For Childhood Cancer" fundraiser. The Chapel Hill club has scheduled 5 dates at Harris Teeter stores. The Raleigh and North Raleigh Clubs have fund-raisers planned for later in the summer. The Cape Fear Club held another successful Texas Hold'em Poker Tournament. I look forward to hearing what your club has planned. The district will also have a "Yellow Duck Race" at the convention in September.

At the International Convention in Baltimore, MD in July we will again have a presentation by the doctors conducting the research that we are funding. Arrangements are also being made to visit the facility. Donations of surgery dolls, pillowcases and other items will also be delivered to the children at the hospital.

The Chapel Hill Club delivered doctor kits, surgery dolls, Reflections books, "The New Normal" videos, pillowcases, activity projects and over \$4,000 in donations to UNC and Duke Hospitals. The club provided brunch for the Chapel Hill Ronald McDonald House. Pillowcases were available for the parents to select for their children being treated at the hospital and their siblings. The directions for making the pillowcases and surgery dolls will be available at the district meetings.

During the ConKerr Cancer Pillowcase Project at UNC, I met a cancer survivor named Morrow. She and her mother came to a club meeting and spoke about their experience and her treatment for non-Hodgkin Lymphoma. There is a need at the hospitals for games and other items to entertain the teenagers during their treatment sessions. Please ask your teenagers and grand children for ideas that we might provide for the kids. There is a TV at each treatment station that could play DVD's or videos. The resource desk keeps some books for the patients to share and could help keep a library for the kids.

Is your club considering a project to help kids with childhood cancer? If so consider applying

for the matching grant program that OI offers. The maximum amount of the award is \$2,500 and is intended to help get a project completed. No funds will be awarded to fund another foundation's project. Contact me for further information and forms.





And by doing so, they also have the opportunity to win a college scholarship!



There are some changes in this year's contest that you should be aware of

The essay length has been increased to 700-800 words

The scholarship amount for District winners has been increased to \$2500.

Although District winners will go on to compete at the International competition, this year there will not be a scholarship awarded at this level. The International winner will receive an engraved plaque and recognition in *The Optimist* magazine.

The deadline for club entries (one per club) in the District contest is February 28, 2011. Full information on the details of submission requirements and links to official rules and program guides are available on the District website www.nceast-optimist.org. There is also information there on how to get participants from both the regular schools and the non-traditional school organizations, such as home schools, private schools and charter schools. One key to the suc-

> cessful recruiting of contest participants is to get the schools involved early, before they have their plans too firmly set.

> I hope your club members enjoy the opportunity to see these kids truly excel through their essays.






