#### Childhood Cancer Campaign

#### Childhood Cancer Campaign

Thanks to all the clubs for their efforts to raise funds for the Childhood Cancer Campaign this year. The families, patients and their medical teams need all the help they can get. Many clubs in the district have held "Kisses For Childhood Cancer" fundraisers. The Chapel Hill Club has raised over \$2,745 this year. The Raleigh Club raised \$327 handing out Kisses on a very hot weekend. Most of the clubs have found it too hot to schedule a Kisses fundraiser during the summer months. The Cape Fear Club held a poker tournament, the North Raleigh Club sponsored the Music and Storytelling Festival and there are several golf tournaments scheduled this fall.

A frequently asked question is what to do with the funds we raise. That is up to the club. One option is to donate to the research for a leukemia vaccine that is being done at Johns Hopkins Hospital. A check can be made out to the OI Foundation, CCC Research Project.

We also have in the district three "comprehensive" cancer treatment hospitals . The designation of a "comprehensive" hospital means that the facility does research, drug testing , and treatments. Our North Carolina hospitals treat patients from several neighbor states that do not have treatment centers for pediatric cancer.

Clubs can also support the Ronald McDonald Houses at Chapel Hill (UNC), Durham (Duke), and Greenville (ECU). Cooking meals and providing items on the wish list for each site are greatly appreciated. Contact me if you need the wish list.

Several other items that help the staff at the hospitals are the surgery dolls, doctor kits, parking passes, and phone cards. There is also a need for items to help the children pass the time while receiving treatments. Many items cost less than \$1, but give a child something to do. New stuffed toys to cuddle are also welcome. We have also made and distributed several hundred pillowcases to brighten the children's hospital rooms. Thanks to those members that helped make that possible. Used electronic games are also requested for the older patients.

The Raleigh Club had another great weekend at the beach when they hosted the Mile of Hope Project in May. Twenty three families and medical personnel were guests. The cost is about \$1,000 per family for the weekend. Any contributions to support this project are appreciated. Mark your calendars to join the fun next May 4-5-6. Does your club have a project that it would like to try? Apply to the CCC Matching Grant program for funds to help make your project a reality. Check the OI web site or call me for more information. The Raleigh Club was a recipient of a grant for the Music and Storytelling Festival.

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At the international convention in July the vote to designate the Childhood Cancer Campaign as a Focus project for the next 25 years fell short of the needed 2/3d majority vote to pass. Major companies are not willing to contribute to organizations that do not have a long term commitment to a project such as finding a cure for childhood cancer. Optimist International will continue to support the Childhood Cancer Campaign to find the cure.

Please join in the fun at the district convention in Myrtle Beach. The annual Little Yellow Duck Race will be held Saturday afternoon in the lazy river at the hotel. Tickets are \$10 per duck.

Prizes of \$100, \$50, and \$25 will be awarded to the first 3 ducks to cross the finish line. You do not have to be present to win. Tickets can be purchased up 'till race time. All proceeds will go to the Childhood Cancer Campaign. Come help the kids cheer on their favorite ducks.

## Boys and Girls Homes of North Carolina







#### **From Your Foundation Rep:**

Your help is needed now! We are approaching the end of our Optimist year and the push is on to make our Optimist International Foundation fund raising goal. Thank you to the clubs and individuals that have already made their gifts. But many of you reading this have not contributed before and some who have generously given in the past but are a bit reluctant due to the uncertain economic conditions this year. To those who have yet to give it is important to remember that many of the kids in the communities we serve need our help more than ever. As Optimist we know we make a difference as individuals and as clubs and we know that the Foundation serves a vital role in supporting our efforts. This message includes some of OIF's successes in 2010. A description of the Presidents Club Program is highlighted along with brief descriptions of other individual contribution programs. Please plan to bring your contributions to the District convention.

**Optimist Wrist Bands** Wrist bands are just \$1.00 Get yours early. What a great way to let everyone know you are an optimist and begin that new member conversation.

**Optimist Panda Bears** There will be a \$100 dollar drawing at the District Convention. I have a couple of bears in reserve just \$10 for the bear and a chance to win \$100.

#### What OIF did in 2010

- 1. Sent 154 students off to college with Optimist International Oratorical, essay and CCDHH scholarships totaling \$171,200.
- 2. Raised \$148,711 for future scholarships, ending the one with endowed scholarship, two additional endowment pledges, and 25 five –year scholarships.
- 3. Paid out \$176,576 to clubs utilizing the Club campaign program and added an additional \$44,478 in interest to Club Campaign funds.
- 4. Helped 475 Optimists help 14,391 children and their families by awarding 20 Club Grants in every OIF Region.
- 5. Sent \$450,000 to Optimist International for the Optimist International Research Fellowship in Pediatric Hematology and Oncology at John Hopkins.
- 6. Renewed 322 members of the Presidents Club and added 43 new members ending the year with 365 OIF members.


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#### **Friends of Tomorrow**

Most public, private and charter schools set their curriculums and select their educational projects over the summer or early in the first part of the academic year. This requires clubs to make these contests known to the faculty and staff at or before this time. 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



A new incentive has been added for the fourth quarter (4th) of this Optimist year.


